

CULT 'GENERAL,' 5 OTHERS HELD TO GRAND JURY

Bonds Set at \$50,000 for
Members Accused of
Kidnap Flogging.

DETROIT, June 9.—"Brigadier General" Wilbur Robinson and five fellow Black Legionnaires were bound over to Circuit Court on bonds of \$50,000 each today for the kidnaping and flogging of a member who declined to attend the order's meetings.

Common Pleas Judge Charles Rubiner ordered Robinson, Charles King, Harold Lawrence, Earl Angstadt, Frederick Gulley and Thomas Cox held for trial at the conclusion of their examination. They were charged with having forced Robert Penland, a steel worker, from his dinner table at gun point last Oct. 5, and having beaten him at a Black Legion meeting when he said he no longer wanted to attend the night riders' meetings.

Judge Rubiner's decision brought the total of Black Legion members held for trial to 19. Yesterday in another court, 13 members of the hooded and robed night riders were held for the kidnaping and murder of Charles A. Poole.

Congressional Probe Dropped
Congressional inquiry into the scope of Black Legion activities in Michigan and other states appeared to have been halted temporarily. Senator Elmer Benson (Farmer-Labor, Minn.), who conferred last night with Prosecutor Duncan C. McCrea, was believed en route to St. Paul, Minn.

Rep. Samuel Dickstein (D., N. Y.), did not arrive in Detroit to confer with Benson over the advisability of pressing for passage of their concurrent Congressional resolution authorizing investigation of all subversive groups similar to the Black Legion in the United States.

Homicide squad officials held Mrs. Dayton Dean, wife of the Black

Legion's "trigger man" in the Poole slaying, for appearance before the grand jury. Known also as Mrs. Margaret O'Rourke, Mrs. Dean was taken into custody with a roomer at her home, George Caples, presumably to testify concerning the expose of the Black Legion appearing daily in a Detroit newspaper under her signature.

POTATO SHORTAGE BELIEVED NEAR END

Prices Expected to Drop Toward
Normal in Few Days.

NEW YORK, June 9.—Many experts and dealers saw hopes today that the nationwide potato shortage, which has skyrocketed prices in New York to 200 per cent of their previous high for the last 10 years, would taper quickly toward normal in the next few days.

In other quarters it was said no pronounced improvement could be expected before two weeks to a month from now, when crops begin to roll from states unaffected by the drought, which dwarfed both Southern and Northeastern winter yields.

The Market News Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture said the market for both old and new potatoes dropped 50 per cent yesterday and that shipments from North Carolina, previously held up by rain, had removed any danger of an emergency.

ALASKA IN GRIP OF RECORD HEAT WAVE

Rapidly Melting Snows Cause Over-
flow of Rivers.

JUNEAU, Alaska, June 9.—Seven forest fires and overflowing rivers today marked the thirteenth day of southeastern Alaska's record breaking heat wave.

The temperature was 80 today. The forest fires were reported, all under control. The heat has caused rapid melting of snows in the mountains and many streams are running bankfull and overflowing in lowland areas.
