

LOW TAX RATE AVAILABLE FOR TIMBER AREAS

\$1-an-Acre Rate Offered to
Owners Applying
This Month.

Indiana landowners who have areas suitable for timber production and wish to take advantage of the state's forest land classification law should file applications with the forestry division this month. Virgil M. Simmons, Conservation Department commissioner, said today. There are approximately 120,000 acres of privately-owned, classified forest land in Indiana while applications for the classification of an additional 10,000 acres are already on file, Mr. Simmons reported.

Each tract submitted for classification must be inspected by a representative of the forestry division before it can be accepted and certified to the auditor of the county in which it is located.

Indiana's forest land classification law, enacted in 1921, seeks to encourage reforestation and timber production throughout the state by listing such classified areas for taxation at a valuation of \$1 per acre, he said.

In return for this low rate of taxation, the owner agrees to make such forestry plantings as may be required to protect the areas from forest fire, and to keep grazing stock out of the area. No tract of less than 100 acres can be accepted for classification.


One or more tracts of classified forest land are located in each county with the major acreage in sections of southern Indiana where soil and other conditions make agriculture unprofitable.

Owners of land which might be acceptable for classification as forest land can obtain applications and other information by addressing the Division of Forestry, Department of Conservation, State Library Building, Indianapolis, Mr. Simmons said.
