

AVIATOR, BRIDE PICK AIR TOUR AS HONEYMOON

Annual All-State Aerial Trip
Scheduled for Monday
Start.

Mr. and Mrs. Clarence McElroy, whose aerial romance began in 1934 during the all-Indiana Air Tour, are to leave Hoosier Airport Monday with the 1936 Air Tour as honeymooners.

Mr. McElroy, manager of the Vincennes airport and a pioneer in stunting tri-motored craft, gained national prominence after crashing in a Mexican jungle a year ago. He was lost for 17 days before crawling, with both hips broken, to an Indian reservation.

The air tour, sponsored by the Indiana Aircraft Trades Association, is to cover 1500 miles throughout the state. It is the largest of its kind in the United States and is limited to 60 planes. Thirty pilots have already made application to join the tour.

RECREATION SITE ON WHITE RIVER SOUGHT

Project Is to Be Sponsored by
Isaac Walton League.

Development of both banks of White River as part of the public domain for recreation purposes is to be a major project of the White River chapter of the Isaac Walton League, which will be organized at a dinner in the Indianapolis Athletic Club June 29.

The chapter is to perfect a long-time program to make the area and the river itself a place for healthful, inexpensive and accessible outings for all persons residing in Indianapolis. William F. Collins, head of the Indiana division of the League, said in announcing the dinner.

Present plans in the Marion County drive call for acquiring land for the public along the stream in this county to a width of a quarter of a mile where possible, with the minimum width expected to be sufficient for a bridge path.

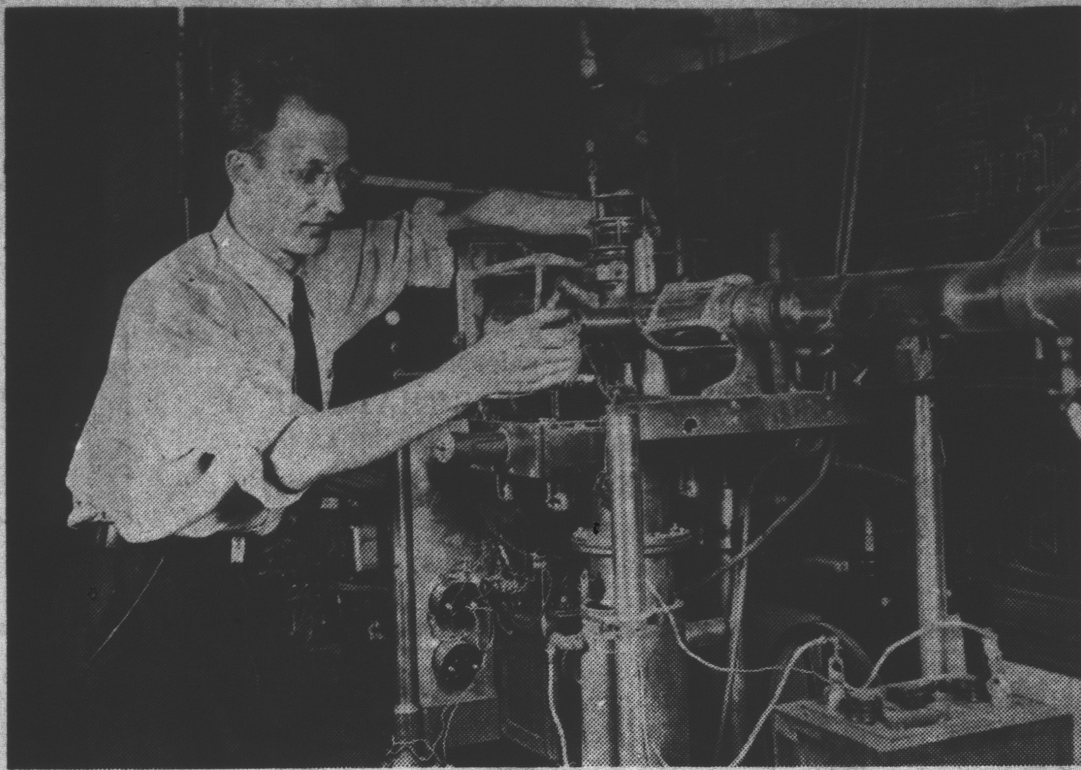

PURDUE EDUCATOR WINS FELLOWSHIP FOR ATOM RESEARCH



LAFAYETTE, Ind., June 16.—Dr. H. J. Yearian, of the Purdue University physics department, is shown above with some of the experimental apparatus designed to aid his research work.

Dr. Yearian has been awarded a National Research Council fellowship for work on the atom and electron with electronic waves. He also designed

an instrument to measure distribution on photographic plates and, with J. D. Howe, perfected a new universal camera for electron diffraction.

The fellowship award is made on a competitive basis, with only the highest 3 per cent of Ph. D.'s in the country eligible. Two positions were created in the physics division.

Dr. Yearian is to continue his work at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, Cal.

NEW FARE SCHEDULE LISTED BY BUS LINE

Two Cents a Mile Rate Effective to
Cincinnati, Madison.

Cuts in bus fares to all points between here and Cincinnati and Madison were placed into effect by the Indianapolis and Southeastern Lines, Will M. Frazee, vice president and general manager, announced.

One way tickets have been reduced one-third, and an additional 10 per cent reduction has been made on round trip tickets. The new fares conform to a 2 cents a mile rate, instead of the 3 cent rate charged heretofore, Mr. Frazee said.

MUSEUM'S 1936 EXPEDITION SET FOR DEPARTURE

June 25 Named as Date for
Start of 7th Annual
Prairie Trek.

Plans for the seventh annual Children's Museum Prairie-Trek Expedition, which is to get under way Thursday, June 25, were being completed today.

The official field expedition for the museum, in charge of Hillis L. Howie, Orchard School director, is to be composed of 15 boys and four senior staff members.

The expedition is to take its members throughout the Southwest for a comprehensive study of the lava beds southeast of Zuni, N. M., including a study of plant and animal life, prehistoric Indian caches and volcanic formations.

Members of the senior staff for the eight weeks' exploration, besides Mr. Howie, are Gordon H. Thompson, Orchard School teacher; John W. Ragdale, Princeton University student, and Ross Olmstead of the Dalton School, New York.

Junior staff members are Alan Appel and Alex Holliday, Indianapolis; and John Reed, Swampscott, Mass.

Other expedition members are Harley Rhodamel, John Masters, Robert Merrill and Samuel Sherwood of Indianapolis; Richard Hart and Alfred Stern, Highland Park, Ill.; Haskell Torrence, Evanston, Ill.; Edgar Foster, Chicago; Thomas Weiner, St. Louis; Edward Schell

and Austin Jenkin, New York, and Daniel French, Summit, N. J. The natural arches of Utah, Monument Valley, Rainbow Bridge, Sherd Spring ruins, Bryce Canyon, and Grand Canyon are to be among the places visited.

The expedition is to make its longest stay in Cotton Wood Gulch, N. M., when it camps for two weeks to seek ancient ruins near the Zuni Mountains.

SEEK STANDARDIZED BEAUTY SHOP PRICES

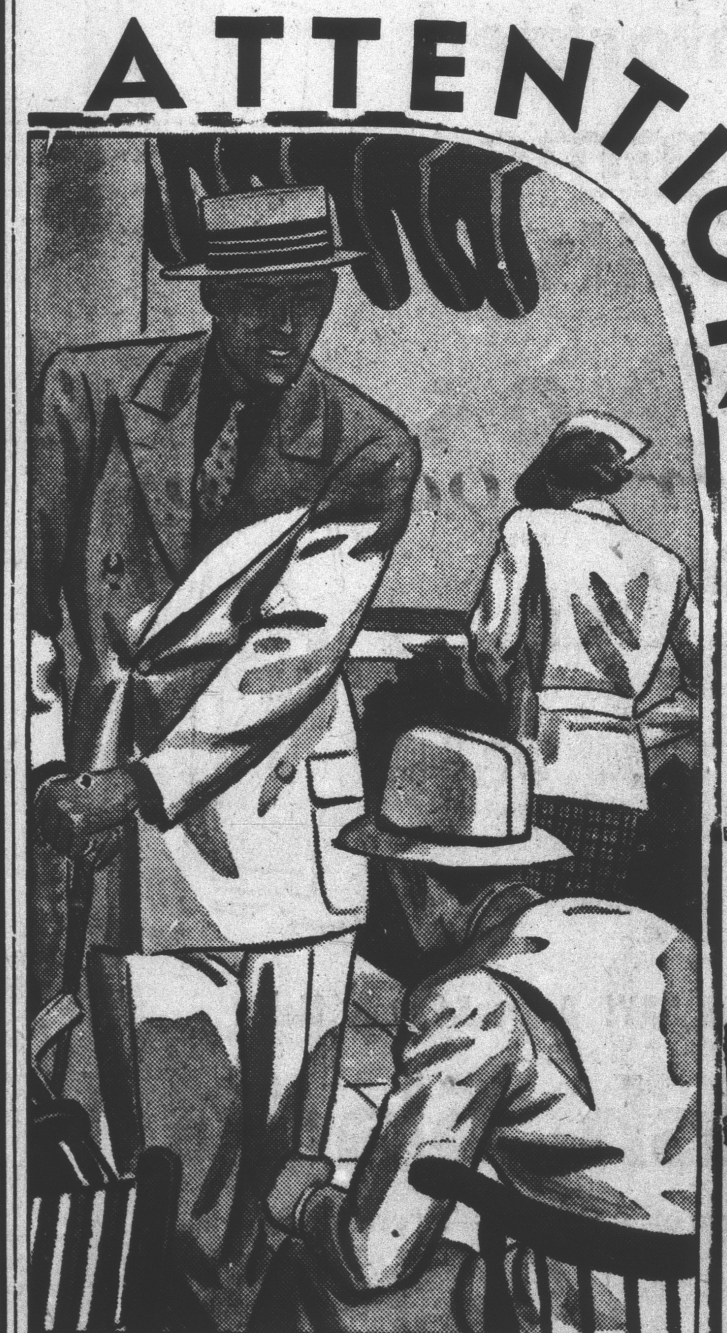
Owners and Operators to Meet for

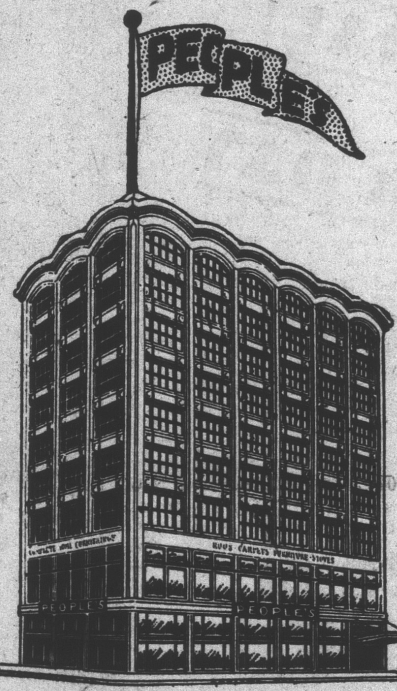

RURAL ELECTRIC LINES PROJECT TO START SOON

120 Miles of Wires to be
Constructed in Shelby
County.

SHELBYVILLE, Ind., June 16.—Glenn Pherigo, county Rural Electrification Membership Corp. secretary, announced today that construction of 120 miles of electric lines is to start in northern Shelby County within the next month. There are 400 members of the REMC in the northern section of the county.

Mr. Pherigo and other county REMC officials have returned from Washington where they sought permission to include construction of

404 miles of lines under one contract. Permission to construct 120 miles of lines was granted, Mr. Pherigo said, and permission to construct the remainder is to be given upon completion of the first contract.
