

STATE'S POWER TO SET WAGES BELIEVED VALID

Interpretation of Court's
Decision Opens Way
for New Appeal.

WASHINGTON, June 18. — The Supreme Court's 5-to-4 decision against New York's minimum wage law does not invalidate state power in this field, Administration lawyers have decided.

This belated interpretation of the court majority's opinion is back of the Administration decision against including a constitutional amendment plank in the Democratic platform, it was reported today.

It is also upon this interpretation that New York and 11 other states have decided to continue to enforce their laws providing for minimum wages for women in industry.

Interpretation Outlined
The new interpretation of the majority opinion by Justice Butler is legalistic but apparently logical. It is about as follows:

The court in the Tipaldo case of June 1 made its ruling on just one point—whether the 1933 New York law involved came under the same classification as the District of Columbia law which the court had knocked out, 5-to-3, in the celebrated Adkins case of 1923.

The lawyers are now pointing to the following statement by Butler: "No application has been made for reconsideration of the constitutional question there decided. The validity of the principles upon which that decision rests is not challenged. This court confines itself to the ground upon which the writ was asked or granted."

The state of New York in this case, Mr. Butler said, "is not entitled and does not ask to be heard upon the question whether the Adkins case should be overruled."

Approval Considered

This, it is argued, leaves the way clear for the court to overrule at any time the fundamental constitutional points of the 1923 decision. This point is further offered as a clue to the reason why Justice Roberts, who had upheld wide state price-fixing powers under "due process" in the Nebbia milk case, went along with the four conservative justices who have been willing to use "due process" to knock down almost any state regulation of business.

New York state authorities are making plans to appeal for a rehearing when the court reconvenes in October, and other states with such laws have indicated co-operation.

But it is believed likely here that an entirely new case, covering the constitutional issues more broadly, must be brought up and argued. This would take a year or more.
