

25 STATES JOIN INDIANA AGAINST PASSENGER SUIT

Motorists' Guests to Have Hard Time Collecting Damages, View.

Twenty-five states have joined Indiana in adoption of "guest-suit laws," limiting liability of car owners for damages sustained by non-passengers in the car, according to Todd Stoops, Hoosier Motor Club secretary-manager.

"Under the common law of accident damage," Mr. Stoops explained, "the operator was held accountable at law for any injuries suffered by other persons riding in his car whether or not the driver was at fault in the accident."

Guest-suit laws, enacted to correct many injustices, provide that passengers can not bring suit against the driver of a car unless caused by other persons riding in his car whether or not the driver was at fault in the accident."

The Hoosier Motor Club sponsored the law in Indiana and it was passed by the Legislature in 1929.

"The practice of giving rides to hitch-hikers is dangerous everywhere, but in states without such laws there is the added hazard that the motorist may be faced with a costly suit brought by the hitch-hiker in the event of an accident," Mr. Stoops asserted.

Howard County Official Freed of Assault and Battery Charges.



TERMINAL FIRM IS TO REMODEL LEASED PLANT

E. Ohio-St Property to Be
Used for Rail-Truck
Distribution.

Remodeling of the Anheuser-Busch Brewing Co. terminal at 920 E. Ohio-St, leased yesterday by Central Union Truck Terminal, Inc., is to begin at once, Thomas Snyder, president, said today. The large ter-

minal is expected to be ready for occupancy within three or four weeks.

With a frontage along Ohio-St of 355 feet, the property extends north along the Big Four Railroad 375 feet. Three buildings, a garage, office and warehouse, are on the property.


Mr. Snyder said the terminal is to be used to receive carload shipments for distribution in Indiana. He pointed out that an advantage of the location for rail-truck terminal purposes is a large area of surrounding ground where trucks may park and unload without street obstruction.
