Former Fireman, Inventor, Fatally Stricken on Engine House Visit.

EDWARD STIEGELMEYER, 1446 Prospect-st., who dropped dead yesterday in Fire Engine Station No. 3, 1136 Prospect-st., from heart disease, is to be buried in Crown Hill Saturday following funeral services in the Roy J. Toller Funeral Home at 2 p. m. He was 61.

Born in Louisville, Ky., Mr. Stiegelmeier came to Indianapolis when a small boy. He was a member of the city fire department several years, but resigned about 20 years ago to work on an automatic train stop he had invented. He was a member of the Masonic order and the Elks lodge.

Survivors are a sister, Mrs. Louis Westfield, Chicago, and a brother, William C. Stiegelmeier, a lieutenant in the city fire department.

SEARCH CONTINUED FOR MISSING SHIP

Coast Guard Vessels Patrol Waters South of Florida.

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla., July 23.—Coast Guard vessels concentrated at the south tip of Florida today in an attempt to establish definitely the fate of the British motorship Nunoca, missing and feared lost with 13 passengers and a crew of nine.

Searchers believed the ship had been destroyed, probably as the result of an explosion, after it left Georgetown, Grand Cayman, on July 4 for Tampa. Coast Guardsmen found many bits of wreckage or cargo which they believed came from the trim, 110-foot vessel.
