

## N. D. RETREAT IS SCHEDULED FOR AUG. 6-9

Catholic Laymen of U. S. to Convene on Campus at South Bend.

NOTRE DAME, Ind., July 24.—Catholic laymen from every section of the United States are to convene at the University of Notre Dame Aug. 6 to 9 to take part in the eighteenth annual laymen's retreat.

The three-day retreat is to be directed by the Rev. Patrick Dolan, C. S. C., assisted by the Rev. John Delaney, C. S. C., the Rev. Frederick Schulte, C. S. C., and the Rev. William Bolger, C. S. C.

All conferences during the retreat will be held on the campus at The Grotto of Lourdes, a replica of the French shrine made famous by the miraculous cures said to be effected there.

In addition to the religious ceremonies Father Bolger is scheduled to deliver a series of talks on the moral aspects of present-day economic problems. Father Bolger is ranked as one of the outstanding Catholic economists in the United States.

## SOLUTION OF CO-ED MURDER NEAR, CLAIM

Sheriff Promises Arrest of Suspect by Tonight.

ASHEVILLE, N. C., July 24.—Sheriff Laurence Brown promised to solve the mystery today of who assaulted and murdered pretty Helen Clevenger in her hotel room eight days ago.

"I will arrest a man and charge him with the murder before tonight," Sheriff Brown said.

He indicated he had known the identity of the man suspected of the crime since Wednesday, but had delayed the arrest in order to gather additional evidence. He gave no intimation of the nature of the evidence.

## COUNTY OFFICIALS SCORE RELIEF COST

\$20,000 Bond Issue Authorized by Bartholomew Council.

COLUMBUS, Ind., July 24.—The high cost of township relief came under fire of the Bartholomew County Council yesterday when it authorized a \$20,000 bond issue for township poor relief for the remainder of the year.

Columbus Township Trustee Carl Blessing, called before the council to explain why funds for 12 months relief had been expended in seven, said withdrawal of Federal funds put a heavier burden on townships.

## ELECTRICAL PERMIT COSTS BLOCK'S \$708

\$234,000 to Be Spent by Department on New Building.

A building permit for \$234,000 in electrical work was obtained by the Wm. H. Block Co. today at a fee of \$708.50, one of the largest in several months.

Installation of 3000 fixtures and 1840 circuits in the new Block Building is to start soon, it was said.

## WALNUT TRACT BURNS

40 Acres of Young Trees Destroyed in Linton Fire.

Sparks said to have come from an engine at a nearby strip mine ignited the tract, destroying it before 60 CCC workers could control the blaze. Loss was estimated at \$2500.
