



Drought-Ravaged Land? No, It's the Statehouse Lawn

The pictures above were not taken in some rural pasture land. They were taken on the Indiana Statehouse lawn. Wild and overgrown with weeds, clogged with vagrant, wind-blown papers, desolate with dead shrubbery, the lawn is an eyesore to downtown Indianapolis. Picture No. 1 shows a corner of shrubbery which has become a trap for waste paper that is allowed to stay where it comes to rest.

Picture No. 2 shows a weed that, even in the drought, attained the height shown in the picture, unmolested by lawn mower. It is in the middle, not

on an outer edge, of the lawn. Picture No. 3 shows a shaggy part of the lawn, with weeds choking out the grass. The state entomologist early this spring advised gardeners to prune out branches of shrubbery killed by the cold weather. That has not been done at the Statehouse and so the drabness of the winter still is carried on into the summer.

Despite four or five automatic lawn sprinklers that may be seen almost any day idle on the lawn, the grass is dead in huge patches.

SHELBYVILLE, Ind., July 30.—The law officially declared war today on alleged gambling devices in Shelby County.

Sheriff Ralph Brown, after conferring with Prosecutor Harold Berger yesterday, served public notice that marble machines, punch boards and other alleged gambling devices must go.

Owners and operators of machines in Morristown, Gwynneville, Rays Crossing, Fairland and Flat Rock are to be charged Friday in court with keeping gambling devices, the sheriff said. The charges are an outgrowth of raids last week-end.

CHURCH GROUP WILL CONDUCT POLL ON PEACE

United Christian Missionary Society Board Reports Large Gifts.

United Christian Missionary Society officials today began plans for taking a peace poll on Armistice Day, 1936.

The poll is to be taken among Disciples of Christ churches under sponsorship of the social education department and several national publications of the church.

At a board meeting yesterday a budget for the new fiscal year, beginning July 1, was approved.

Financial reports for the fiscal year closing June 30 showed a total

of \$1,342,500 was received from all sources. Gifts from churches and individuals amounted to \$680,176.

Last year was reported one of the best in the history of the society for gifts, with a total of \$1,128,622 reported, an increase of \$65,478 over the previous year.

The board approved the employment of the Rev. Virgil Havens, Indianapolis and Butler University graduate, as an individual solicitor with the department of financial

resources. Mr. Havens was a missionary to Africa.

The Rev. and Mrs. Paul D. Kennedy, Fayetteville, Ark., were returned by the board to their former post in the Philippine Islands.

A motion also was adopted to send greetings to Dr. and Mrs. William F. Rothenburger, Indianapolis, who are now in England as delegates to an annual conference of the Churches of Christ.
