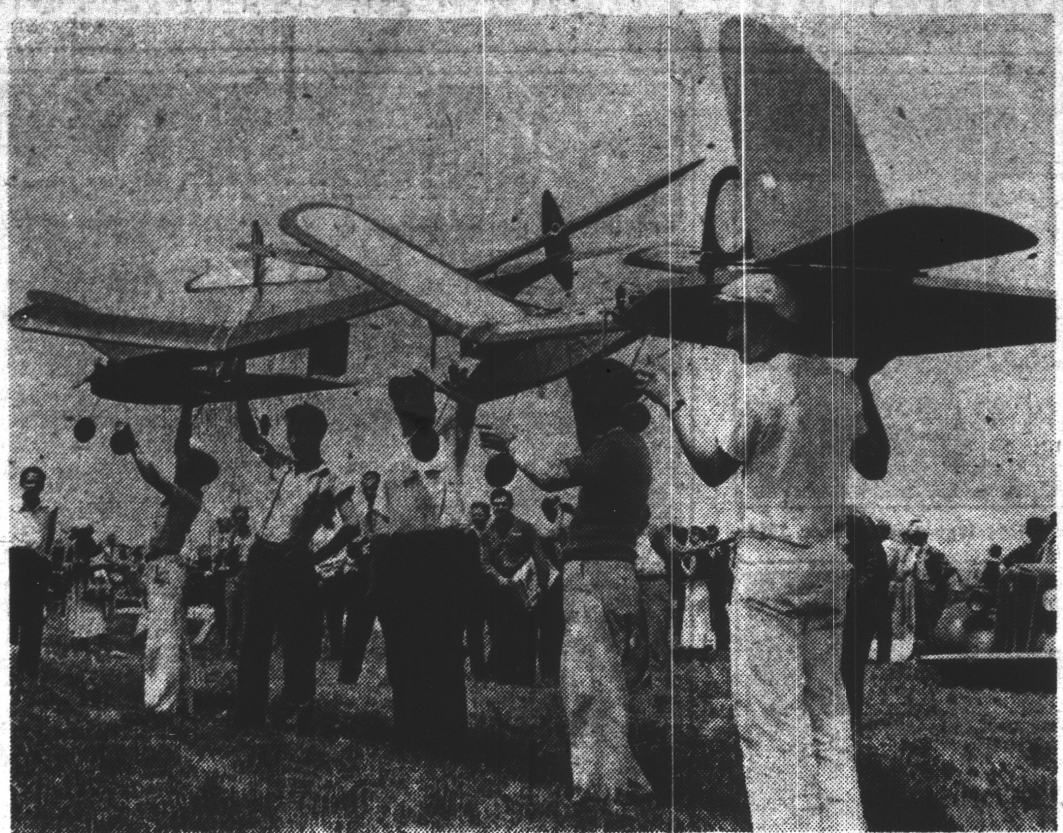
### WAGE DISPUTE SETTLED

## CAUTION LINES PUT ON ROADS

Yellow Stripes to Indicate Points Where Passing Is Dangerous.

Yellow lines parallel to the black center line are being painted on Indiana highways to indicate points where passing other vehicles is dangerous, James D. Adams, State Highway Commission chairman, said today.

All curves where there is a change of direction of three degrees or more and all grades where the motorist's vision is less than 1000 feet are to receive the caution-zone markings, Mr. Adams said.

Work has been in progress for several days in the Greenfield and LaPorte districts.

"Motorists disregarding the caution marking by passing other vehicles going in the same direction will be guilty of reckless driving and subject to arrest," Mr. Adams said.
