

## STATE TO OPEN BIDS TOMORROW FOR RURAL LINE

340-Mile Extension to Serve 1400 Farmers in Marion, Adjoining Counties.

Bids for building an additional 340 miles of rural electric distribution line to serve 1400 more farmers in Marion, Boone, Hamilton and Montgomery Counties are to be opened tomorrow, M. J. Briggs, Indiana Statewide Rural Electric Membership Corp. general manager, said today.

Mr. Briggs said construction is to start as soon as the contracts are let and that engineers have assured him the line would be completed "before bad weather."

In Boone County 160 miles of line, serving more than 600 rural customers have been completed. This is the first rural power line to be built in Indiana under the REA program through which Federal funds are made available for construction of rural lines at low interest rates and with payment spread over a 20-year period.

The completion of the 340 miles of line will bring electric service to about 2200 Indiana farmers.

Most of the 500-mile project, which is being constructed with an REA loan of \$567,926, is to be in Boone County.


Federal funds also are to be available for building lines in Whitley and Shelby Counties. A loan of \$84,000 has been approved for the Whitley County REMC for building 80 miles of line to serve 275 customers.

A loan of \$112,500 has been approved for the Shelby County REMC for building 115 miles of line to serve 517 customers.

## 50 GET TRYOUTS IN FAIR AMATEUR SHOW


Judges Select Winners in First of Series.


