

**BICYCLE RIDER  
INJURED WHEN  
STRUCK BY CAR**

Three Others Are Hurt in  
Minor Wrecks; Woman  
Held After Crash.

Struck by an automobile while  
riding her bicycle in the 4700 block  
on Madison-av, Rhea Eberhardt, 15,  
1563 Dudley-st, was in a serious  
condition at her home today with  
severe cuts, bruises and probable  
internal injuries.

George R. Bridges, 53, 1608  
Draper-st, told deputy sheriffs that  
his automobile struck the girl after  
it had collided with another car  
driven by George Gant, 56, of  
Franklin.

According to Bridges, Gant  
started to pass his car about 25 feet  
from a bridge and apparently did  
not see the girl until almost past  
his automobile. In trying to avoid  
hitting the girl, Gant swerved his  
car against the Bridges machine,  
causing the latter to strike Miss  
Eberhardt.

Taken to Home

The girl was taken to her home  
by passersby. Deputy Sheriffs Hagg-  
dale, Stevens and Malo investigated  
the accident.

received minor injuries when the  
automobile in which they were rid-  
ing collided with a car driven by  
John W. Wilson, 49, 1201 Vande-

ford-av, was arrested on charges of  
drunkenness, operating a motor ve-  
hicle while intoxicated and failure  
to have a driver's license after the  
automobile she was driving struck  
a car driven by J. H. Doesch, 36 N.  
Bradley-st, at 40 W. 38th-st, and  
then struck a parked automobile.
