

ASSOCIATION OF BAPTIST CHURCHES TO HOLD CONFERENCE SEPT. 15 AND 16

Talks, Reports on Year's Work Are Scheduled

Membership Increase of 2000 in Six Years Is Announced.

Arrangements for the fall conference of the Indianapolis Association of Baptist Churches, to be held Sept. 15 and 16 at the Thirty-first Street Baptist Church, were outlined today by the Rev. O. B. Sartor, moderator.

Reports on the association's progress and addresses on most phases of the organization's work are to fill the two-day session.

Reports to be heard include one by the Rev. U. S. Clutton, department of stewardship chairman, and the secretaries of church membership. Mrs. Clinton announced an increase of approximately 2000 members in Indianapolis during the last six years.

He also is to report that the association has received more than \$13,000 in gifts to the missionary fund during the last year.

The Rev. Oren A. Cook is to report progress of the ministerial training course, which is directed by the Rev. Carleton W. Atwater, First Baptist Church pastor.

Services are to begin at 9:30 a. m. Tuesday, Sept. 15, with an address by the Rev. William O. Breedlove, Calvary Baptist Church pastor.

"Candide Gleams," a report of church conditions, is to be read by the Rev. W. F. Buckner, New Bethel. This is to be followed by a review of work carried on in the Northern Baptist Convention, including a discussion of evangelism, Christian education, missionary giving, Christian social action and youth enlistment.

Laymen to Organize

A layman's committee on evangelism is to be organized at a meeting on the opening day called by Herbert C. Young, department of evangelism chairman.

Among Tuesday's speakers are to be the Rev. H. B. Leonard, Crawford Industrial School director, Zionsville; Mrs. F. C. Schnitz Rumanian work director, and Mrs. LeRoy Farmer, Baptist Christian Center woman's work director.

Pastors of new and growing Baptist churches are to be introduced in a program to be known as "Churches of Tomorrow," according to the Rev. Clive McGuire.

Discussion Planned

The evening session of the first day's meeting is to be devoted to the topic of personal discernment of Yesterdays and the Church. Today's Rev. E. R. Dimick, youth enlistment committee chairman, is to be in charge. He is to be assisted by Brunson Mather, Karl Schieck, Howard Jewell, Catherine Best, Richard Tibbs, Dorothy Moate and Jack Jones. The Rev. H. G. Rowe is to be adult supervisor for the discussion.

Prof. William G. Mather, Franklin College, is to be the principal speaker at the opening of the second day's meeting. His subject is to be "The Christian College."

Prof. Mather's address is to be followed by a discussion of pastoral work. The Rev. Adolph Bredy, Bethel Baptist Church pastor and president of the Baptist Ministerial Conference, is to be in charge.

Women Are to Meet

The Rev. C. W. Atwater is to speak on the work of the Ministers and Missionaries Board, to be followed by a women's meeting. Mrs. Asa E. Hoy is to serve as chairman of the women's session.

The Wednesday afternoon program is to close with an address by the Rev. Reuben H. Lindstrom, Southport Baptist Church pastor, on "Victorious Church."

An address and the awarding of a Sunday School trophy is to bring the conference to a close Wednesday night. The closing address is to be made by the Rev. Herschel O. Folger, First Friends Church pastor, on "Christian Nature and Christian Nurture."
