

CAPITAL RUMOR LINKS GOVERNOR TO POST AT I.U.

Observers Predict McNutt
Will Bar Politics Until
1940 Campaign.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 10.—Gov. McNutt will not become Secretary of War, according to latest advice here.


It is reported that he would not accept the post, made vacant by the death of Secretary George H. Dern, even were it offered to him by President Roosevelt.

Instead he is likely to accept the presidency of his Alma Mater, Indiana University, upon his retirement from the governorship, it is said. Should such a plan be carried out, I. U. President William Lowe Bryan would be retired as president emeritus.

Was Criticized by Thomas
Why Gov. McNutt will not accept the war secretaryship is explained, by those purporting to know, on the grounds that he wants to escape further branding as a "militarist," which has been one of the chief charges hurled against him by liberal and radical groups.

Norman Thomas, Socialist candidate for President, refers to Gov. McNutt as the "Hoosier Hitler." He coined this title because of the Governor's sending national guardsmen to scenes of labor conflict. Mr.

NEW PLANE SCHEDULE BRINGS INDIANAPOLIS, GOTHAM NEARER



Indianapolis is to see the inauguration of the fastest Indianapolis to New York airplane passenger service in its history next Tuesday when Transcontinental and Western Air, Inc., is to establish a 4-hour-and-21-minute service to that city.

Under this new schedule a plane is to depart

daily at 11:28 a. m. and is to arrive 4 hours and 21 minutes later in New York. The new mid-day service brings Indianapolis 45 minutes closer to New York.

The change is to result in a reduction of scheduled time across the United States by as much as 1 hour and 15 minutes.


The plan for Gov. McNutt to take

Senator Sherman Minton's place, by the latter being appointed to the Federal Court of Appeals in Chicago, has been dropped, it was said.




