1 THE LATTER is far more important. Some of the happiest marriages are those of persons with 20 or 30 years difference in physical ages, the husband being usually the older, although I know many happy marriages where the wife is many years older than the husband. But 20 or 30 or even 5 years difference in their mental ages—that is in their mental ability—would mean that one was very bright and the other very stupid and this rarely makes a successful marriage.
