

## rites set for W. M. Hailey, retired cleric

Former Illinois Preacher  
Was Father of Indiana  
A. P. Manager.

THE REV. W. M. HAILEY retired minister of the Illinois Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church died yesterday in his home in Jacksonville, Ill. He was 71. Funeral services are to be held in Jacksonville tomorrow.

A graduate of Whipple Academy in Jacksonville and Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington, Ill., Mr. Hailey held pastorates in nearly 20 Illinois churches before retiring two years ago. He was the father of Foster Hailey, Indiana manager of the Associated Press.

Mr. Hailey was editor of the Record, a weekly newspaper in Barry, Ill., from 1910 to 1921. Survivors besides the son here are the widow, two daughters, Mrs. Margaret Berry, Los Angeles, and Mrs. Ruth Royce, Clinton, N. J.; three sons, Howard Hailey, New York; Arthur Hailey, Denver, and Cordell Hailey, Redwood City, Cal., and two brothers, Charles Hailey and George Hailey, both of Peoria Heights, Ill.

## WORKERS OWN INDIANA MINE, CHEAT SLUMP

Co-Operative in Elberfeld  
Has Steady Work Record  
and No Labor Trouble.

ELBERFELD, Ind., Oct. 7.—With a record of no labor disputes, steady work and income since 1928, this town of 800 persons boasts one of the few coal mine shafts owned and operated by the workers.

Paced with the problem of buying the mine, closed by owners in 1928, or being stranded in a town without jobs, the miners made a down payment of \$4000 on a "junk" price of \$10,000, renamed it the Warfield mine and paid off their indebtedness in three years.

serves without additional pay, said today the first year of the co-operative experiment "could not be termed easy sledding," but had proved successful.

"In the old days the men were lucky to average one and a half or two days' work a week," he said "but today, under joint ownership, they average a steady three and one-half days. We boast that the town of Elberfeld never has had a depression."

Mr. Douthitt said that of 114 men working in the mine, only two are not shareholders. He said the original four shares, purchased by the miners for \$200, now are worth \$750, that the change of ownership increased the average daily tonnage from 400 to 630 a day, and that although there have been no cash dividends the miners "have reaped a host of dividends in contentment."

Paced with the problem of buying the mine, closed by owners in 1928, or being stranded in a town without jobs, the miners made a down payment of \$4000 on a "junk" price of \$10,000, renamed it the Warfield mine and paid off their indebtedness in three years.
