LISTS PROGRAM
OF CONVENTION**

Sixty-Third Annual State
Meetings Is to Begin at
Fort Wayne, Oct. 16.

The program for the sixty-third annual convention of the Indiana Women's Christian Temperance Union, to be held Oct. 16 to 18 in the First Methodist Church of Fort Wayne, was announced here today. Highlight of the convention, according to Mrs. Elizabeth T. Stanley, Liberty, Ind., state president, is to be an address by Miss Helen V. Byrnes, Evanston, Ill., Youth's Temperance Council general secretary.

Miss Byrnes is expected to announce that the national organization is seeking a million-dollar fund for temperance education. In this campaign, Mrs. Stanley said, Indiana would give active support.

Mrs. Stanley to Speak

The convention is to open with an address by Mrs. Stanley. The program also includes a report from Mrs. Paul Halladay, North Manchester, head of the scientific instruction department, and a discussion of the effect of alcohol upon health by Mrs. Odessa Rayle, Spiceland.

Mrs. Lillian Flynn, Elkhart, is to give the report of the department of Americanization and citizenship; Mrs. W. A. Doty, Frankfort, and Mrs. Roy Kiser, Peru, are to present to the convention the value of evangelism.

Mrs. Charles Norman, New Albany, and Mrs. R. E. Hinman, Indianapolis, are to conduct the seminars on international relations and motion pictures.

Others to Report

Mrs. Floyd O. Sonofrank, Tippecanoe, national and state director of the speakers' contests, will announce the number of diamond medals awarded during the year and the number of speeches made.

At the business session, Mrs. Robert L. Julius, Muncie, Loyal Temperance Legion secretary, is expected to report to the convention that there are more than 1000 boys and girls enrolled in the Indiana legion.

Other reports will be read at that session by Mrs. Ida M. Mix, Kokomo, first vice president; Mrs. G. A. Snider, North Manchester, second vice president; Miss Mary E. Woodard, Fountain City, corresponding secretary; Mrs. Robert Foster, Donnell, Greensburg, recording secretary; Mrs. S. C. Stimson, Terre Haute, treasurer, and Mrs. M. A. Addison, New Palestine, Youth's Temperance Council secretary.



SOUTH BEND, Ind., Oct. 7.—The state was expected to rest its case today in the trial of Jack Perkins, alleged Dillinger gangster, on first-degree murder charges in St. Joseph Circuit Court.

A parade of witnesses identifying Perkins as one of the gang which robbed the Merchants National Bank of \$29,000 in June, 1934, and killed Patrolman Howard Wagner in the getaway, has been offered by the state.

**RELIEF IS TOPIC
OF OSTEOPATHS**

Township Cases Eligible
for Treatment, Dele-
gates Told.

Osteopathic physicians may serve indigent patients in relief providing authorization of the township trustee is obtained, Dr. C. B. Blakeslee, Indianapolis, told the opening session of the thirty-eighth annual Indiana Osteopathic Association convention today in the Hotel Lincoln.

Discussing state and Federal social security legislation, Dr. Blakeslee said provisions in acts already passed gave osteopathic physicians the same privileges as other practitioners.

"The osteopathic profession must see that those who have depended on osteopathic physicians continue to get these services," Dr. Blakeslee said. "This can be done through legislation."


