

SPEECHES SPUR DEMOCRATS TO FINAL EFFORTS

Closing Work of Campaign
Outlined for State
Party Workers.

State Democratic leaders today exhorted party workers to place Indiana in the Democratic column on election day.

"Prove definitely to the nation that Indiana is a Democratic state," urged Gov. McNutt.

Yesterday at a state committee meeting in the Indianapolis Athletic Club, the Governor reiterated his request for a tightening of battle lines to combat the Republican attack on President Roosevelt and the state ticket.

Senators Frederick VanNoy and Sherman Minton declared themselves "100 per cent for Roosevelt and the state ticket," and M. Clifford Townsend, gubernatorial nominee, urged county and district officers to get out the vote on election day.

Other speakers at yesterday's meeting included Omer S. Jackson, state chairman; Democratic Mayors and candidates.

Following the meeting Democratic candidates and district and county workers met in an executive session to check polls and make final campaign plans.

McNutt Charges 'Frameup' in Radio Talk

Gov. McNutt declared in a radio address last night that the mailing of letters to employers by employers explaining the unemployment insurance act is "part of a gigantic frameup on the people."

He said the letters contain "half-truths and untruths."

"This insidious and malicious program is being carried on despite the general acceptance of the new legislation as being the most forward-looking in the history of the state in protecting the laborer against the hazards of unemployment and the certainty of old age," he said.

Republican Urges End of 'Dictatorship'

The "end of one-man dictatorial government in Indiana" was declared necessary in a radio address last night over WIRE by Joseph E. Hartman, G. O. P. nominee for State Senator. This can be achieved only through a Republican victory Nov. 3, he said.

He declared that he favors repeal of the state reorganization act and the gross income tax law. Tax reductions and elimination of wastes in government also were urged.
