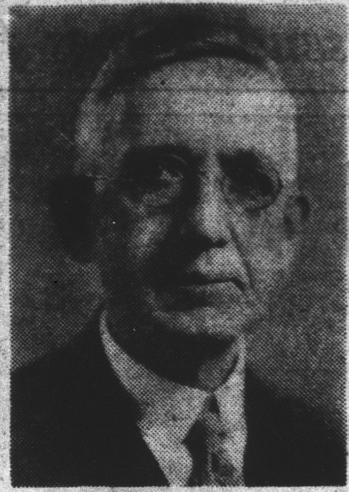

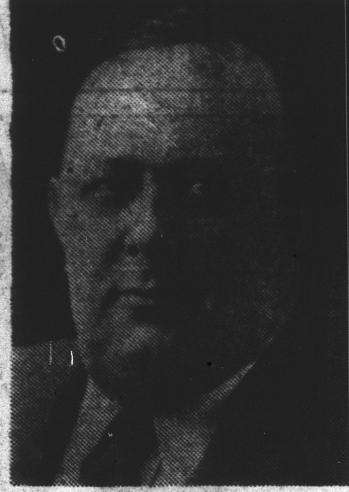

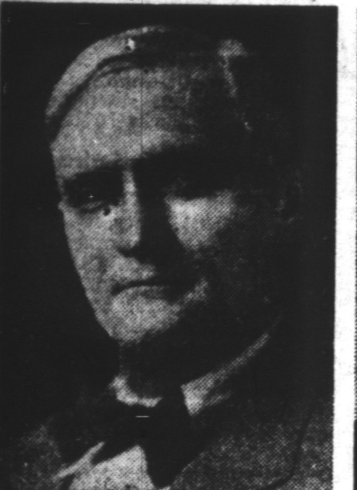

The Democratic Party, bolstered by the election of its full legislative ticket in Marion County, today apparently had increased its control of the Indiana General Assembly.

In 11 State Senate races, returns today showed 10 Democrats elected. Walter R. Beardsley, Elkhart County, Republican, defeated Elias C. Swihart of Elkhart, one of 12 Democratic senators seeking re-election.

Six Democratic senators re-elected were: Jacob Wells, president pro tempore of the Senate; E. Leroy Porticus and E. Curtis White of Marion County; John Bright Webb (joint state senator for Marion and Johnson Counties); Joseph M. Robertson of Jackson, Scott and Washington, and William D. Hardy, Vanderburgh County.

## Hendricks Is Holdover

Thomas A. Hendricks is hold-over Democratic Senator from Marion County.

Newly elected to the Senate from Marion County was Joseph F. Sexton, former deputy prosecutor, who defeated Leo X. Smith.

Thirteen State Representatives—nine Democrats and four Republicans—were re-elected. Rep. Frank G. Thompson, Bluffton publisher and House majority leader, was re-elected. Rep. Roy J. Harrison, Attica manufacturer, a Republican leader, was defeated by Alva H. Warnick.

The state yesterday voted on candidates for 26 Senate seats and the full 100 positions in the House of Representatives.

## Three Are Re-elected

The three local members of the House who were re-elected are:

Edward P. Barry, 449 N. Arsenal, labor representative, member since 1933, former member of Indianapolis city council; Harry Hill, Edinburg, (joint state representative), farmer and manufacturer, and Charley Lutz, 4528 Winthrop-av, electrician, member of the 1935 assembly.

Delaware-st, attorney and formerly in prosecutor's office. But-ler U. graduate, also Harvard law school graduate; James J. McCaslin, 253 N. Arsenal, grocer; Lawrence C. Miller, 2525 Broadway, first superintendent of Marion County highways, field manager of Portland Cement Association; Miss Bess Robbins, 216 E. 37th-st, attorney, member of 1933 legislature but not candidate in 1935, born in Anderson, graduate of Manual High and Indiana Law School; Herbert C. Wadsworth, Castleton; Edward C. Wakelam, 1424 Albany, Beech Grove; Ernest C. Ropkey, 22 N. Audubon-rd, president of Indianapolis Engraving Co., former president of city council of Indianapolis; Rev. Marshall A. Talley, 470 W. Fall Creek-blvd., a minister, former editor of a Negro publication and one time secretary of National Race Congress, now pastor of Mount Zion Baptist (Turn to Page Nine)

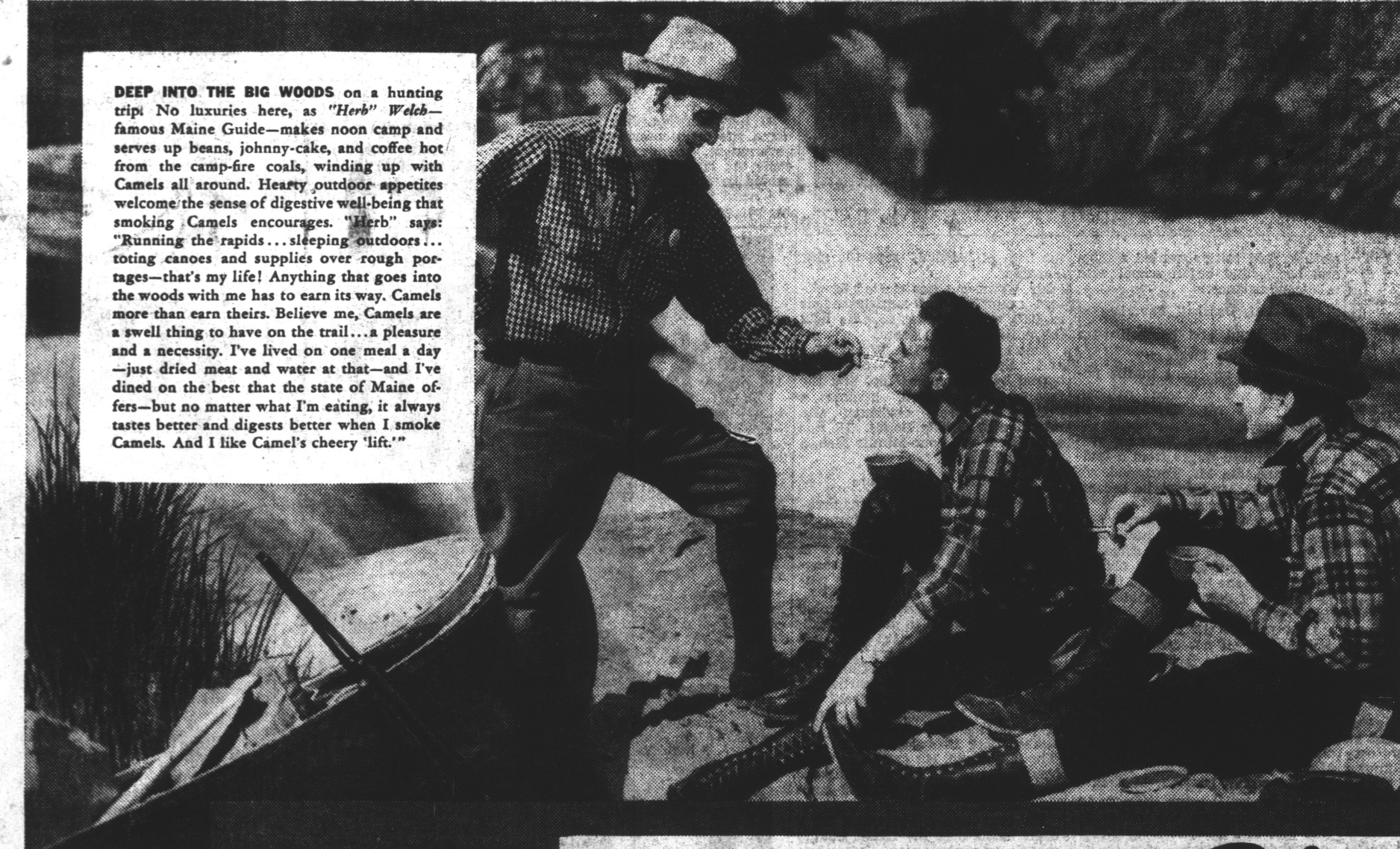

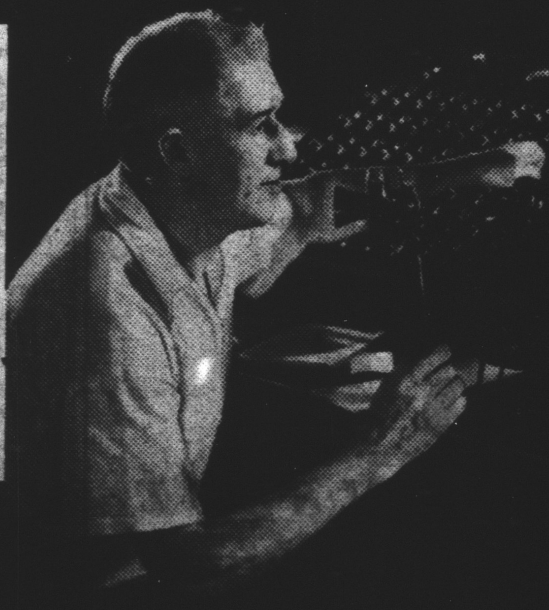

## IRISH WON'T BREAK WITH BRITAIN, CLAIM

DUBLIN, Nov. 4.—Eamonn De Valera, president of the Irish Free State Council, revealed for the first time last night that Ireland under the new "Almost Republican" constitution will not break away from the British Empire.

Addressing his Fianna Fail Party at a conference, De Valera said that when the new constitution is introduced in Parliament, there will be introduced also a bill providing for continuance of present relations "until such time as the Irish people can pronounce expressly on these relations."

## CONSOLIDATES POWER

VIENNA, Nov. 4.—Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg consolidated his power as leader of the Austrian Fascist-Corporative State today by reorganizing his cabinet and eliminating the last elements linked with the Heimwehr semi-military organization. Eduard Bear-Baarenfels was eliminated as vice chancellor and security minister. His place as vice chancellor was taken by Field Marshal Baron Ludwig Hugelrath, who also is commander-in-chief of the new National Militia.
