Reports and Roll Call on  
Final Business  
Session.

Committee reports on Americanism, child welfare and junior activities and a membership roll call today were to conclude a two-day American Legion Auxiliary conference of state department presidents and secretaries in the Legion National Headquarters.

Preliminary estimates indicated a heavy advance enrollment, department leaders said. The present membership is estimated at approximately 425,000 persons. Reports from legislative committees and discussion of proposed 1937 activities occupied the opening sessions yesterday. Officers and committee members attended a dinner last night in the Indianapolis Athletic Club.

Fledged to support the Legion's legislative program, the auxiliary report included sections on adequate national defense, universal service, care of veteran's widows and orphans and help for disabled veterans.

Mrs. Enid Lemstra, Clinton, legislative committee chairman, and John Thomas Taylor, Legion legislative director, spoke.
