M. E. Courses to Be Given in Five District Centers.

The seventh annual all-Indianapolis Methodist leadership training schools are to open Monday in five district churches.

Dedication of a new system of audiphones and loud speakers in the Central Avenue M. E. Church is to be marked tomorrow morning with special services.
