Catholic Parish to Raise Funds for Mission.

Members of St. Rita parish, in an effort to spread the Catholic faith to Negroes of the City, have planned a series of breakfasts at Cathedral High School to obtain funds for an eight-day mission.

First of the breakfasts is to be served in the Cathedral school auditorium tomorrow from 6:30 until 11 a. m. Breakfasts also will be served on Feb. 28 and March 7.

The mission is to be conducted by the Rev. Fr. Vincent Smith, S. V. D., the only Negro priest from Kentucky.

The St. Cecilia Club, of which Harold Cavanaugh is president, is sponsoring the breakfasts and has pledged itself to defray costs of the mission.

Administrators of St. Rita's parish are the Rev. Fr. Bernard Strange and the Rev. Fr. Herman Mootz.

All Catholics of the city have been urged to assist in the movement, especially during this month which is devoted to the welfare of Indian and Negro missions.
