A farewell reception to the Rev. Dr. Joseph Barrett Tieman, S. T. D., is to be held at the SS. Peter and Paul Cathedral rectory from 3 to 5 p. m. and from 7 to 8:30 p. m. tomorrow. Father Tieman is to leave soon to take the pastorate of St. Joseph's Church at Corydon.

Father Tieman was born in Washington, Ind., and studied at St. Meinrad's Seminary, where he was ordained in 1925 by the late Bishop Joseph Chardrand. He served as assistant at St. Patrick's Church here for three years and later was transferred to the Cathedral. He took post-graduate work in Rome in 1931 and 1932, and received the degree of Doctor of Sacred Theology at the Angelicum Pontifical Institute.

In his new work, Father Tieman is to have, besides the Corydon pastorate, the missions at New Middletown, Universal and Buena Vista. His assistant is to be the Rev. Fr. Joseph Busald.
