

PETER VAN GEYT HEADS SECURITY BRANCH IN CITY

Named to Direct Work in 49
Counties After Civil
Service Test.

Peter J. Van Geyt has been appointed field representative in charge of the Indianapolis District Social Security Board office to succeed Albert A. Kuhle, acting manager, H. L. McCarthy, regional director, Chicago, announced today. Mr. Kuhle has returned to the Chicago office.

The Indianapolis District office, located on the sixth floor, Meridian Life Building, 307 N. Pennsylvania St., administers Title II of the Social Security Act in 49 central Indiana counties.

In order more efficiently to serve the 360,000 Hoosiers who will have obtained Social Security account numbers, the Board contemplates establishing branch offices in Terre Haute, Muncie, Richmond, Lafayette and Bloomington.

One of the major activities of the men's clothing industry of Roches-

ter offices will be to assist people in the preparation of claims for benefits. Many claims already have been filed in behalf of persons who have reached 65 since Jan. 1.

Claims also are being filed in behalf of the estates of persons who have died. An Indianapolis woman recently was the recipient of the first death claim paid in the United States under the provisions of the Social Security Act.

Preliminary to assuming charge, Mr. Van Geyt was called to the Social Security Board headquarters in Washington. There he undertook an extensive training course.

Mr. Van Geyt was selected on the basis of high grades obtained in a Civil Service examination.

He is a graduate of Springfield College, Mass., where he was an honor student. Later he spent two years in post-graduate study at the University of Rochester.

He has wide experience in industry as a labor manager and as a production engineer. He also served extensively in the insurance field.

Served Shipping Board

During the war Mr. Van Geyt was selected as one of a group of 24 to specialize in industrial relations management. He served in such capacity for the U. S. Shipping Board Emergency Fleet Corp.

In his capacity as one of the Board of Labor managers in the men's clothing industry of Roches-

ter, N. Y., Mr. Van Geyt assisted in formulating one of the first group state laws as a result of the Social Security Act.

Mr. Van Geyt is president of the Indiana Stamp Club. He resides at 3220 N. New Jersey St., and has three daughters, Virginia, Diana and Roberta, pupils of School 60.






