

MONTH OF BIRTH EFFECTS FAME, SCIENTIST SAYS

Purdue Conference Told of Weather's Effects on Human Beings.

LAFAYETTE, June 23.—Babies destined to become eminent persons are more apt to be born in February and March than in any other month, Dr. Ellsworth Huntington, Yale human geographer, said today at the Purdue Institute of American Policy and Technology.

It is known that cool weather has a direct effect on mental activity, Dr. Huntington said. "It apparently has a curious effect on the birth of eminent people."

He explained that children born in these two months are conceived when the parents are at the height of physical vigor and that cool temperatures at the time of birth make for an increased mentality.

Dr. Huntington said that statistics show that in the United States children born in March live on an average of four years more than those born in June or July.

Prof. Mills Speaks

Dr. Clarence A. Mills, University of Cincinnati professor of experimental medicine, suggested today that medical scientists attempt to provide the air-conditioning industry with standards upon which it may base installations.

He spoke on the relation of climatic and weather influences on health.

Other speakers today were to include Dr. J. H. Kolb, University of Wisconsin rural sociologist, and Dr. Walter B. Pitkin, author and lecturer.

In an address last night Dr. Pitkin said that the spirit of uncertainty is delaying prosperity that would result from a needed \$50,000,000,000 housing program.
