JEWISH STATE ACTION WAITED

Zionist Congress O. K. of
Plan to Negotiate for
Homeland Expected.

ZURICH, Switzerland, Aug. 10.—A plenary session of the 20th World Zionist Congress was expected to adopt overwhelmingly today a seven-point resolution to negotiate for the creation of a sovereign Jewish state in Palestine.

Wrangling in the political commission delayed the plenary session which had been set for this morning. Agreement on the exact wording was found difficult and the commission, after meeting almost all night, met this morning and arranged to meet again this afternoon.

The congress was to reconvene at 7:30 tonight to hear final pleas by Dr. Weizmann, pro, and M. M. Ussishkin, con, on the resolution. Immediately thereafter a vote was forecast.

EXTRADITION DENIAL HAILED BY HOBOES

BOSTON, Aug. 10.—"King" Jeff Davis had announced today that the executive board of the Hoboes of America had gone on record in in-

dorsement of Governor Charles F. Hurley's refusal to extradite James Cunningham, 37, Negro fugitive from a Georgia chain gang.

"We are hoping that the Governors of every state in the nation will follow his action so that we can break up these chain gangs of the South," he said. "Many of the poor

devils who are not members of our organization are in the gangs on vagrancy charges simply because they cannot find jobs."

Governor Hurley refused to extradite Cunningham on grounds that the fugitive would be treated "cruelly and inhumanly" if returned to Georgia.

LA GUARDIA URGES SEX CRIME CHECK

NEW YORK, Aug. 10.—Mayor F. H. La Guardia took charge today of a drive to end a wave of sex crimes against minors. He learned that a man was arrested in New York City

every six hours for some offense involving sexual depravity.

Mayor La Guardia suggested incarceration for life of insane sex offenders after Police Commissioner Lewis J. Valentine confessed he did not know how to halt depredations which have resulted in 1460 arrests and the murder of two small girls this year.


