


## Spider Keeps Guard Over Eggs

## Ralph Polk Re-Elected Head of Volunteers of America Board

Ralph Polk was re-elected president of the Volunteers of America executive board at its annual meeting in the Columbia Club today. Other officers re-elected were J. Martin Antrim, vice president; E. H. Wolcott, treasurer, and Col. Earle F. Hites, volunteers director, secretary. Judge Dan V. White was elected to the board. Other board members re-elected were Arthur R. Robinson, Chester W. Albright, Clarence I. Baker, Dr. Thomas J. Beasley and Bishop H. H. Fout.

The board approved Col. Hites' recommendation to establish a new free employment bureau.

Reports of the year's activities revealed that 547 families were assisted and that furniture, supplies and garments were provided for many of them.

In aiding 1000 transients, 2000 meals and 1500 lodgings were provided. The Theodore Home, operated by the volunteers, gave lodgings to 803 women, girls and children, provided 16,085 meals and gave home care to 344 of 116 families.

Under the CCC act extending the life of the corps to 1940, any youth between the ages who is out of work and in need of a job is eligible to enroll regardless of whether or not his family is on relief or in need and in danger of going on relief.

However, no applicant is eligible for re-enlistment in less than six months after expiration of a previous enlistment, unless his service was continuous. No applicant who has served a full two years in the Corps is eligible for re-enlistment. Mr. Hites said.

## CALVIN COOLIDGE'S SPONSOR DIES AT 79

NORTHAMPTON, Mass., Sept. 30 (U. P.)—Judge Henry P. Field, of Hampshire Probate Court, who started Calvin Coolidge on his legal career, died of heart disease at a hospital today. He was 79 yesterday.

It was in Judge Field's office that Mr. Coolidge read law after graduating from Amherst College, also the jurist's alma mater.

In 1895 Judge Field sponsored Mr. Coolidge for admission to the Hampshire County Bar. Twenty-four years later it was Judge Field, as a presidential elector, who nominated Mr. Coolidge for Vice President.

## RESERVE BOARD AID TO RESIGN HIS POST

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30 (U. P.)—Joseph A. Broderick will send to the White House today his resignation as a member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve Board.

Chester C. Davis, fellow-member of the Board, confirmed the report that Mr. Broderick had forwarded a letter of resignation to President Roosevelt dated today and asking that it be effective today.

Mr. Davis said that Mr. Broderick was returning to the banking business in New York and that an announcement concerning that also would be made today.
