

SUPREME COURT HINTS AT MEANS TO OUST BLACK

Hughes Infers 'Interested'
Counsel Might Win
Hearing.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 (U. P.).—The Supreme Court was believed today to have indicated a way to challenge the constitutional eligibility of Hugo L. Black to sit as one of its justices.

Legal experts expressed this belief after studying the decision of Chief Justice Charles Evans Hughes, in which the Court denied two petitions charging that the new Justice was ineligible because the emoluments of that office were increased by Congress while he was a member of the Senate.

Lawyers pointed out that the Court's reason for rejecting the pleas was that neither of the petitioners had established sufficient personal interest—but "merely a general interest common to all members of the public."

Chief Justice Hughes' explanation, it was believed, clearly indicated that any attorney representing litigants before the Court might raise the question again and, if sufficient personal interest was shown, obtain a definite ruling from the Court on the Justice's eligibility.

JEFFERSON COUNTY TAX PLEA IS MADE

MADISON, Ind., Oct. 12 (U. P.).—The Jefferson County Board of Public Welfare today had petitioned the State Tax Board for restoration of tax levies.

In the original welfare budget, \$119,285 was requested to cover expenses for the next year, the advertised rate being 42 cents. The rate was reduced by the County Council and the Board of Tax Adjustments to 32 cents.

The petition asserts that the levies so fixed will fail to maintain adequately the welfare service of the county.

DISPUTE GASOLINE RATES IN TRUST CASE

Prosecutors and Defense
Seek Agreement.

MADISON, Wis., Oct. 12 (U. P.).—Prosecutors and defense attorneys tried to settle privately today their dispute over gasoline price ranges in the winter of 1935-1936, a major point in the trial of 23 oil companies accused of violating the Antitrust Act.

Attorneys for the oil companies and their executives insisted on employing prices reported in three trade journals, also indicted. The prosecution employed a different

range, quoted by Carl O. Beroth, Chicago oil broker.

Mr. Beroth, first Government witness, said the prices he quoted were used by private brokers. He testified that because of unusually severe weather in the 1935-1936 winter, consumption dropped and gasoline prices slumped. During this time, he said, the trade journals published unfluctuating higher prices.

ROAD SIGNAL LIGHT BIDS TO BE OPENED

Bids will be opened Oct. 19 by the State Highway Commission for installation of traffic actuated signals at the intersection of Highways 6 and 41 in Highland and at the intersection of Roads 30 and 41 at Schererville. Earl Crawford, chairman, said today.

Both intersections carry heavy traffic in and out of Chicago. Operation of the traffic lights will be governed by the movement of traffic over control "pads" located approximately 200 feet back from the intersection.

ORLEANS, Ind., Oct. 12 (U. P.).—Funeral services will be held tomorrow for Dr. W. A. Patton, 68, prominent Orleans physician, who died at the Mayo Clinic, Rochester, Minn., Saturday following an operation. Dr. Patton, active in Democratic politics, had practiced medicine here since 1896.

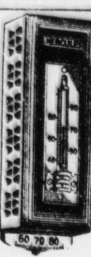

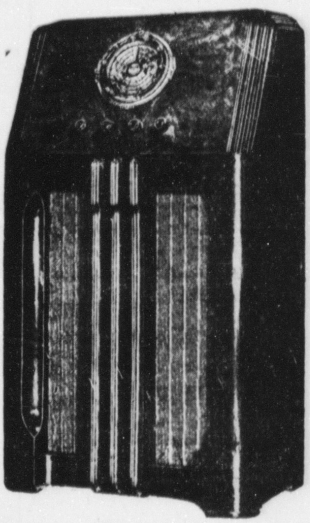

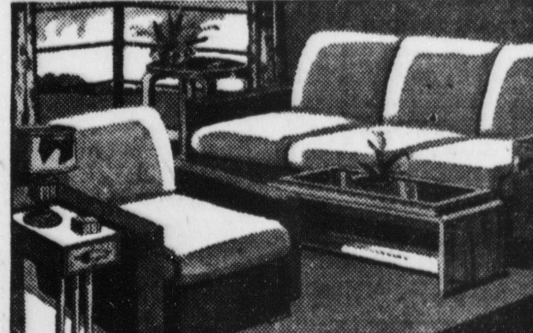
