

Young Abbes Score Again In New Book

Trio's Shrewdness Shown In Observations on Hollywood.

That inimitable Abbe trio has done it again. For, undoubtedly, Paul, Richard and Johnny's latest offering, "On All Places" (Stokes), will make the ranks of the best sellers as did their "Around the World in Eleven Years."

They begin their narrative by describing their long and, to them, thoroughly enjoyable, bus trip East after leaving their Colorado ranch. Their extended midwinter stay in Connecticut where they befriend the author, Konrad Bercovici, their experience with autographing books in New York and Boston after becoming "famous" authors, their encounter with movie scouts and the ensuing trip west to Hollywood all come in for mention before the reader gets to the real meat of the book, the children's experiences in the film capital.

Observations Are Shrewd

In their simple and often laughable style they make shrewd observations about the city and the movie stars they meet. The following excerpt is only one example of numerous similarly mature-sounding statements which the children make:

"Hollywood seems to be the only place in the world we have ever heard of where a human being can go to work almost the minute it is born. But then it also seems to be the only place in the world where you can be born enough before you even started to be a grown-up person."

For the most part the children have liked the people they met in Hollywood, and they seemed to have met all the "big" names in the film industry. Discreetly they have not mentioned names when speaking of some of whom they did not approve. They definitely formed negative opinions of Hollywood women who bleach their hair and parade the streets in slacks.

Show No Disappointment

In describing their experience while taking screen tests at several of the major studios, the children state frankly that their failure to be signed for a film contract did not disappoint them. They say that they do not care for acquiring fame in the films, and it isn't likely that they are motivated in such a statement by a feeling that they must defend their possible lack of acting ability. They don't need any more fame.

Their book shows them to be just what they believe themselves to be, average American children who, in accompanying their globe trotter parents, have been fortunate enough to travel more than most people do in a life time. (C. C.)
