

## New Graduate Music Courses To Be Discussed at Indiana U.

BLOOMINGTON, Oct. 13.—Music department heads of the nation's leading state universities are to discuss graduate music courses and provisions for a doctorate of music at a three-day meeting opening tomorrow at Indiana University.

Dean B. W. Merrill of the I. U. School of Music said he expects one of the largest annual meetings in recent years. The program includes inspection of the new music building, reception, dinner and the Indiana-Illinois football game in addition to the business sessions.

Among those expected are Charles A. Sink and Earl V. Moore, president and musical director, respectively, of the University of

Michigan; F. B. Stiven, University of Illinois music director; Royal D. Hughes, Ohio State University music director; P. G. Clapp, University of Iowa, and H. W. Stopher of L. S. U.

### REMIT \$500 PENALTY ASSESSED MERRILL

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13 (U. P.).—The Bureau of Air Commerce announced today that a \$500 penalty assessed against Dick Merrill for violating takeoff regulations at the Washington Airport, has been remitted.

Mr. Merrill, transport pilot for Eastern Airlines and trans-Atlantic flier, said in defense of his takeoff that he had not been advised of regulations he was accused of violating.

### PLANE SALES TO CHINA INCREASE

\$1,189,000 Worth of Aircraft Materials Bought In August.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 13 (U. P.).—The Commerce Department reported today that China, the United

States' best customer for airplanes, purchased \$1,189,178 worth of aeronautic products in August, bringing its total for the first eight months this year to \$3,632,086.

Japan's purchases in August amounted to \$152,173. Argentina was the second best air customer, purchasing \$906,478. Turkey was third with purchases of \$880,700.

Sales to the Chinese were largely responsible for making August air exports a record with a total of \$5,158,818.

During the first eight months aeronautic exports totaled \$24,289,-

243, 75 per cent above the 1936 period.

At the same time, the Commerce Department disclosed that the United States exports of general merchandise to Japan in the first eight months this year totaled \$216,720,000 an increase of more than \$100,000,000 over the same period last year, while imports totaled \$143,793,000, an increase of \$35,000,000.

Exports to China in the January-August period aggregated \$43,007,000, as compared with \$30,926,000 in the same period of 1936.

Imports from China totaled \$80,764,000, an increase of \$25,446,000.

### MISSOURI TO GET CORNHUSKING MEET.

DES MOINES, Ia., Oct. 13 (U. P.).—Sponsors of the National Cornhusking Contest announced today the annual tournament will be held Nov. 4 on a farm near Marshall, Mo.

Ten states will be represented by two contestants each. Wisconsin is entering the tourney for the first time. Other entries will come from Illinois, Iowa, Nebraska, Missouri, Indiana, Kansas, South Dakota, Ohio and Minnesota.
