TAX BUREAU STAFF 'FREE TO UNIONIZE'

Agency Bans Coercion of Any Employees.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14 (U. P.).—Employees of the Internal Revenue Bureau were advised today they are entirely free to join any union they

may desire, but the Bureau would not countenance any coercion. Acting Internal Revenue Commissioner Charles T. Russell, taking cognizance of an active campaign by several organizations to unionize Federal employees, issued instructions to all supervisory officials of the Bureau designed to prevent interference with the "orderly administration" of the Bureau.

The rules:

1. The Bureau will maintain an absolutely impartial position concerning employee organizations.
2. No coercion will be permitted of Federal employees and employees

should be advised they are "entirely free to join or not to join a union as they may desire."

3. Properly certified representatives of any Federal union may be permitted to address the employees before or after business hours on "union affiliation."
4. No individual soliciting for membership will be permitted in the offices of the Bureau.
5. Collection of union dues will be permitted during the luncheon period "so long as such activities are conducted without coercion and without interference with business."

Yesterday, Edward B. Hall, Chicago, Investment Bankers' Association of America president, spoke on "Protection of Investors by Public Authority."

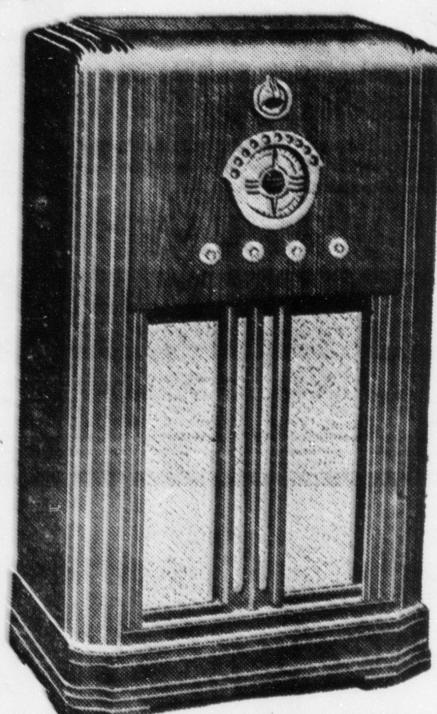
