YOUTH QUIZZED
IN CAR KILLING

Boys Say Parked Motorist
Fired When They Stopped
To Offer Help.

MISHAWAKA, Oct. 14 (U. P.)—Sheriff William Hosinski tested four theories today in an attempt to solve the "motiveless" murder of Melba Moore, 16.

Adolph Stropfer, 20, the girl's fiancé, and Charles Walton, 17, a friend, brought Miss Moore dying to her father's home Tuesday night. They said a man who they thought was having difficulties with his car fired at them when they stopped to offer their assistance on a lonely road. The girl, sitting between Walton and Stropfer in Stropfer's car, was shot in the head. Walton was grazed on the shoulder by a bullet.

Sheriff Hosinski speculated the man was:

1. A "fence" waiting to receive stolen goods.
2. A fugitive from justice.
3. A maniac.
4. Interrupted in a petting party, possibly with a married woman.

Sheriff Hosinski said he suspected no one, but was holding Stropfer on an "open" charge in hope that questioning would remove minor discrepancies in his story.

Members of the Indiana Library Association today sought means of improving library service throughout the state.

Here for the Association's 29th annual convention, members put forth a plan calling for certification of librarians, state aid for public libraries, retirement or pension plans, codification of library laws and extension of library service.

Governor Townsend said he favored good library service for the entire state, but added that before State aid can be expected, librarians should equalize service.
