

Parolee Held as Suspect in Massage-Robbery of Lawyer

WALTHAM, Mass., Oct. 15 (U.P.)—A San Quentin Prison parolee has confessed, police announced today, that he was the "Good Samaritan" burglar who administered an impromptu massage to a prominent Boston lawyer while looting the latter's bed-room.

Police said that Robert Emil Ulrich, 25, of Stockton, Cal., also had confessed to robbing two distant cousins of the late President Calvin Coolidge of \$525 in cash and gems the same night. He was arraigned

"Stop right there!" commanded a voice from the darkness.

"What you need," the marauder

said, "is a massage of the nerve
