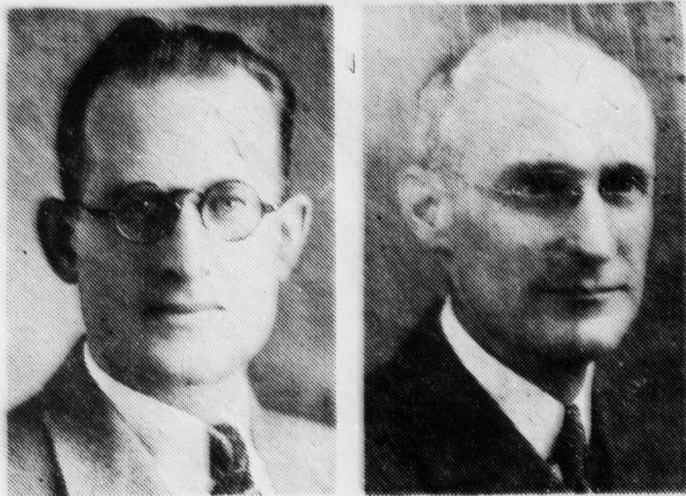
Harvey O. Burnett, Harrisburg, Pa.; Edwin C. Wilcox, Dayton, O., and other lodge national officers are expected to attend.

ditional libel, counselling to assault and counselling to murder.

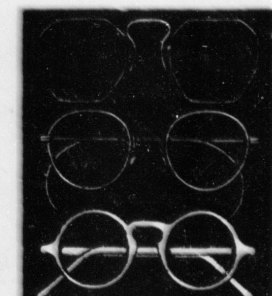
