

JOHN RAUCH, FORMER COUNTY CLERK, 87, DIES

Retired Cigar Maker to Be Buried After Rites Tomorrow.

JOHN RAUCH, former Marion County clerk and retired cigar manufacturer, died last night in his apartment, 1321 N. Meridian St.

He had lived in Indianapolis for 67 years and was active in business and Masonic circles until his retirement several years ago. He was 87.

Mr. Rauch came here from South Gate in 1870, when he organized a tobacco company which he operated until 1910.

In that year, he was elected County Clerk on the Democratic ticket and held office for four years. He was active in the old Commercial Club and was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite and the Shrine.

Survivors are two sons, John G. Rauch, Indianapolis, and Edward J. Rauch, Los Angeles; a daughter, Mrs. Emma R. Wemmer, Indianapolis, and four grandchildren, Norman R. Kevers, Miss Jane Rauch, Miss Anne Rauch and Mr. G. Rauch Jr. Mrs. Rauch, Mr. Rauch's wife, died 20 years ago.

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There are no immediate survivors.

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
