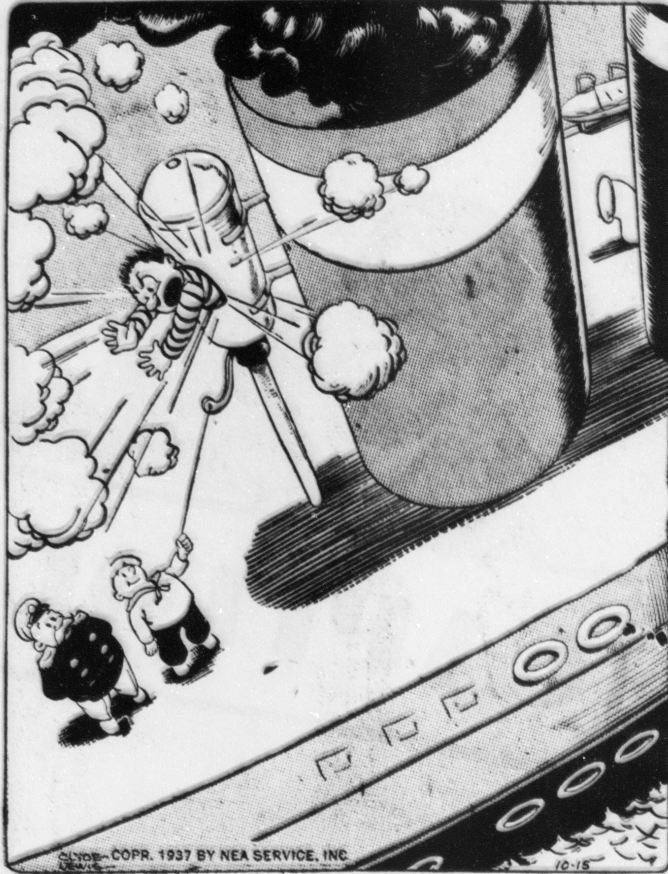

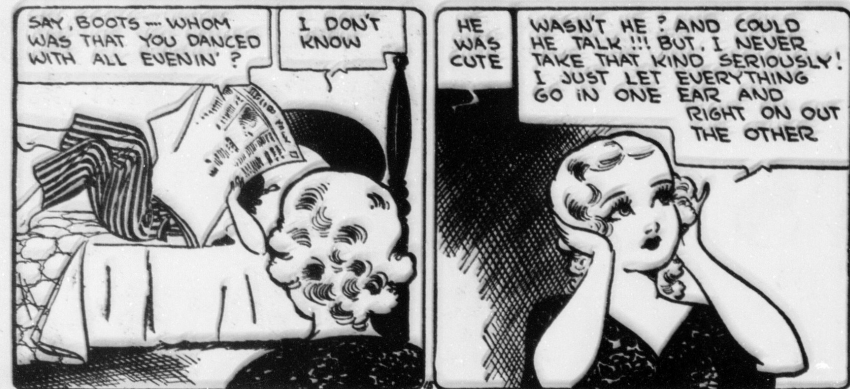

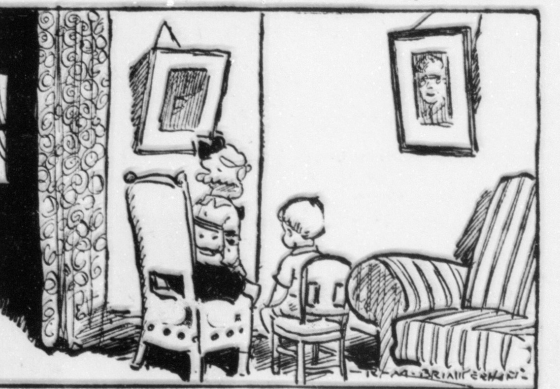

Consequently, the first music drama broadcasts will come from San Francisco, whence we shall hear the second act of Verdi's "Aida" tonight. WIRE will carry all but the first 15 minutes of the broadcast—from 11:45 o'clock to midnight. The first quarter hour will be on the NBC-Red network.

Once more the stars are those who later will glitter from the Metropolitan stage in the country's longest opera season. Gina Cigna, the sensational prima donna of last year's Italian repertory at the Metropolitan, is to have the title part.

The Rhamdames will be Giovanni Martinelli, and the Amneris, Bruna Castagna. Richard Bonelli, Emanuel List and Norman Cordell also will be in the cast, with Gaetano Merola conducting.

At 10 a. m., the Cincinnati Conservatory will be on the air for its second autumn program. Brahms' first Piano Quartet, Opus 25, and the Schubert Sonatine, Opus 137 No. 1, will be heard.
