## 3 Meetings Will Be Held Next Week

Church Federation Seeks To Continue Preaching Mission.

The Evangelistic Committee of the Church Federation of Indianapolis has been organized again to assist all Protestant churches of the city in conducting evangelistic campaigns this fall and winter.

The committee at its first meeting in the Roberto Park Church recently arranged a series of three inspirational meetings, known as an evangelistic mission for Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday nights in the First Baptist Church.
