## Indiana Employment Service To Occupy Larger Quarters

An expansion and unification move will take the Indiana State Employment Service offices into new quarters Nov. 1 at 148 E. Market St., formerly occupied by the Fidelity Trust Co.

The office is to be expanded in anticipation of new duties which are expected to accompany the start of unemployment compensation benefit payments April 1.

In announcing the expansion, George J. Smith, manager, said that any additions to the Service personnel will be made from a list established through examinations last spring.

The Service has taken a 10-year lease on its new office site, and expects to occupy the building's first six floors.

The State Employment Service's administrative offices are to remain in the State Office Building at 141 S. Meridian St.

## 50 Offices to Pay Benefits After April 1

About 50 offices in Indiana are to distribute unemployment compensation benefit when payments begin next April 1.

The offices are to co-operate with state employment offices, Clarence A. Jackson, division director, said. Administrative details are being worked out now, so they may be approved by Federal authorities before being put into operation.

Indiana is one of 29 states to begin payments next year. Benefits here are to be based on previous earnings of unemployed persons, with the maximum set at \$15 a week for 15
