

Morgenthau Is Not as Sure of Sound Budget In 1939 as Roosevelt

1937 Treasury Estimates Are Believed Overly Optimistic and May Be Reason for Cautiousness of Secretary.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27.—President Roosevelt's "expected balance" of the budget in the next fiscal year contrasted today with Secretary of Treasury Morgenthau's inability to estimate whether the Government's books would be in the red or black June 30, 1939.

Mr. Roosevelt's objective since last January has been a balanced budget. As 1937 Treasury revenue estimates were demonstrated last week to have been overly optimistic, Secretary Morgenthau began to avoid committing himself on balanced budget prospects.

Certainty of new taxes and uncertainty of stock market developments combine to confuse and dominate the immediate political outlook here, including prospects for the extraordinary session of Congress which will convene Nov. 15.

Ordered New Revenue

President Roosevelt has stipulated new revenue to balance any new expenditures for farm relief. Budget experts now are looking for \$100,000,000 or so of free money with which to finance a corn loan against falling prices. So far there is no indication that the money will be found. Unless it is discovered, the corn loan must be financed by new taxes, new borrowing or by economies.

The national debt already is within \$50,000,000 of the \$37,000,000,000 point at which Mr. Roosevelt expects it to become stationary before a fall. To meet new revenue conditions stipulated by Mr. Roosevelt, Congress will have to hike taxes if the New Deal's ever-normal granary bill is passed. It will cost around \$70,000,000.

These new taxes probably will be indirect, so far as the public is concerned, and most likely in the form of processing taxes directly upon processors of farm commodities. But any tax bill is explosive business with primary campaigns and a Congressional election coming on.

Unless taxes are levied to offset expected farm relief expenditures, all chances of a balanced budget must vanish. The outlook for a bal-

formly more optimistic. He is under powerful but so far ineffective business pressure to relax some of the New Deal tax restrictions in an effort to quicken commercial and industrial activity. Business is notably anxious for modification of the tax on corporation surplus accounts and the tax on capital gains. Debate of proposed modification will consume much time in the special session of Congress.

Arguments Bolstered

Stock market fluctuations, which have had an alarming downward trend, bolster some arguments offered in behalf of tax law modification and may persuade Congress and the President to action. There is no doubt that the Administration realizes the potentially adverse political and economic effects of a panicky market.

Real reduction in Federal spending probably would be felt first and most in such states as those in the following paragraph. States on farm

relief should be able to count on a continuing scale of Federal aid. Cumulative figures for fiscal years 1935-36-37 reveal 11 states which have enjoyed soil conservation and AAA rental and benefit payments in excess of \$300,000,000. These States probably can expect to continue to live in the style to which they are accustomed so far as farm funds are concerned:

Arkansas, \$22,500,000; Illinois, \$101,200,000; Iowa, \$145,900,000; Kansas, \$139,800,000; Minnesota, \$64,200,000; Mississippi, \$68,400,000; Nebraska, \$92,500,000; North Dakota, \$72,200,000; Oklahoma, \$85,100,000, and Texas, \$235,000,000.

FULLER IS GRANTED STAY OF EXECUTION

but granted the prisoner the additional time to file a petition for rehearing. Fuller now is in the Michigan City State Prison death house.

He was sentenced on Oct. 31, 1936, by Vigo County Circuit Court Judge John W. Gerdink. Trial records showed that Mr. Mankin was killed July 17, 1936, when he attempted to arrest Fuller for highway robbery and criminal assault. Fuller was captured in Paris, Ill., the next morning.

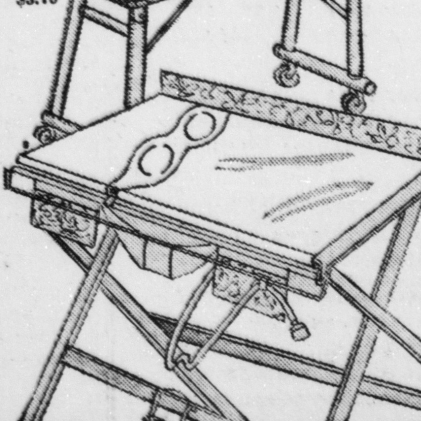
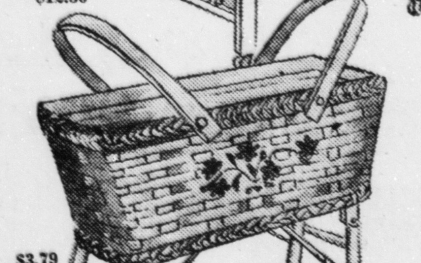
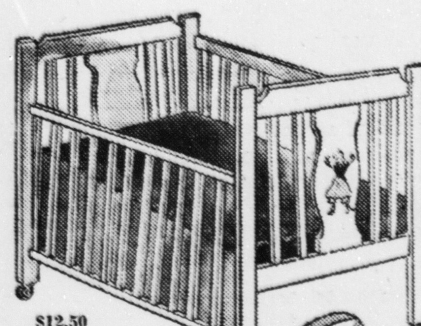
