Film Shows Arms Race

League History Traced In 'March of Time'

With a world's arms budget six times what it was in 1913, the new "March of Time" due tomorrow at the Indiana, will show the race toward war in an episode called "Arms and the League."

The film traces the League of Nations' course from its beginning in 1918. Wilson, Clemenceau and other peacemakers are shown. Later Ramsay MacDonald, Briand and Stresemann are shown at Geneva, where the League settled 17 major disputes without war.

More recent developments are traced, including the rise of Fascist powers, the Ethiopian invasion, the departure of Germany, Italy and Japan from the League, and Anthony Eden's resignation as British Foreign secretary.

A second chapter shows the formation of historic Key West, with WPA resources combating the effects of depression and tornado. "March of Time" will be seen at the Indiana along with the feature film, "In Old Chicago."

J. E. Maddy To Visit Here

Ada Bickling Presides at Music Conference.

ST. LOUIS, March 31.—Miss Ada Bickling, director of the Jordan Conservatory of Music, Indianapolis, and second vice president of the National Music Educators Conference, presided at the third general session of the conference convention in the Civic Opera House this morning.

Speakers included Dr. Howard Hansen, American composer, conductor and Eastman School of Music director; John G. Paine, representing the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers, and a representative of the American Federation of Musicians.

Dr. Joseph E. Maddy, conference president and music professor at the University of Michigan, announced today that he will spend several hours with friends and members of the Jordan Conservatory faculty in Indianapolis Sunday en route to Ann Arbor.

In a press conference yesterday, Dr. Maddy started a heated discussion among delegates with a defense of "swing" music.

"If the younger generation can take swing music in the same semi-serious vein it takes comic strips," the educator said, "then swing music is not going to damage the youthful appreciation of good music."

NED SPARKS AND VINCE BARNETT IN NEW SHOWS HERE




Trouble on the party line besets Vince Barnett, movie comedian who will lead the cast of "Calling All Stars," a revue opening tomorrow at the Lyric.
