

OBSERVANCE OF HOSPITAL DAY HERE PLANNED

Local Institutions to Hold Open House Tomorrow; Programs Arranged.

Indianapolis hospitals will observe National Hospital Day, tomorrow, with open house receptions for visitors interested in making tours of inspection, according to J. B. H. Martin, section chairman of the National Hospital Day Committee.

Programs for the day have been announced by superintendents of five city hospitals.

At City Hospital, which last year won first prize for sponsoring the best observance in the United States and Canada, the day will open with a flag raising ceremony at 7 a. m. conducted by the McIlvaine Kothe Post of the American Legion assisted by hospital nurses.

Visitors are invited to attend and will be shown the new wing, not yet completed. Open house will be held until 4 p. m. Superintendent Charles W. Myers, stated.

Albert H. Scheidt, state Hospital Day chairman and Indiana University Medical Center assistant administrator, said the Center will maintain open house for returning patients and visitors. The new clinical building, to be dedicated formally on Saturday, will be shown. Mr. Martin, section chairman of the observance, is administrator of the Center.

Special departmental exhibits are to be shown at St. Vincent's Hospital, Sister Rose, superintendent, announced. Graduates and students at the hospital will serve as guides, and movies will be presented during the afternoon and evening by the State Board of Health.

Superintendent John G. Benson of Methodist Hospital invited attendance of those who wished to make a tour of inspection but said he "could promise no elaborate preparation."

St. Francis Hospital will have open house from 2 to 4 p. m. Sister Dincentine, superintendent, said latest equipment will be displayed at that time.

Albert G. Hahn of Evansville, Protestant Deaconess Hospital administrator, is chairman of the National Hospital Day committee, which each year awards two prizes to hospitals sponsoring the most effective observance.

50-50 Baby to Spend 2 Days of Each 14 With Foster Parents

LOS ANGELES, May 11 (U. P.).—The custody of 5-year-old Barbara Jean Weatherford, known as the "50-50 baby," was split in new proportions between her parents and foster-parents today.

By order of Juvenile Judge Robert H. Scott, the girl will spend 12 days of each two weeks with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Weatherford. The other two days she will spend with Mr. and Mrs. Claude Baxter, a childless couple who took her as a baby because her seven brothers and sisters had whooping cough.

Judge Scott's ruling dissolved a truce whereby the two families had divided the girl's custody "50-50" the past year.

The Baxters came into court yesterday seeking to adopt the girl on grounds that she had been "abandoned" by her natural parents. Judge Scott called all four parents into his chambers. He told the natural parents that they had lost all moral right to their child, but still were entitled to her by natural law.

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HEARING SATURDAY ON AIRPORT BONDS

Would Raise \$70,000 for Experiment Station.

A hearing on the proposed \$70,000 bond issue to pay the city's share of the new Federal radio aircraft experimental station is to be held at 10 a. m. Saturday before the State Tax Board.

The City Council already has passed an ordinance authorizing the City controller to prepare the bonds. State Tax Board approval is all that stands in the way of the bond sale, which has been set tentatively for May 20.

Mayor Boetcher said he expects the Tax Board to approve the issue. The sale of \$225,000 in bonds to finance the College Ave. relief sewer has been set for May 19. The State Tax Board approved the bond issue last week.

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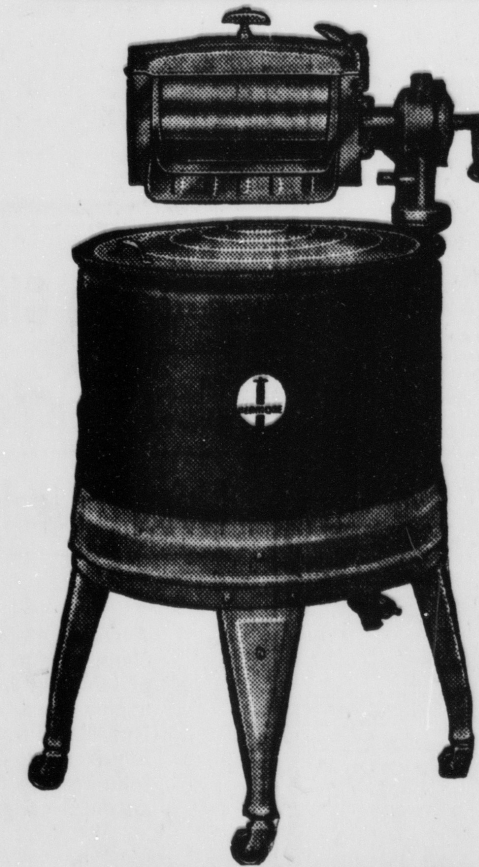
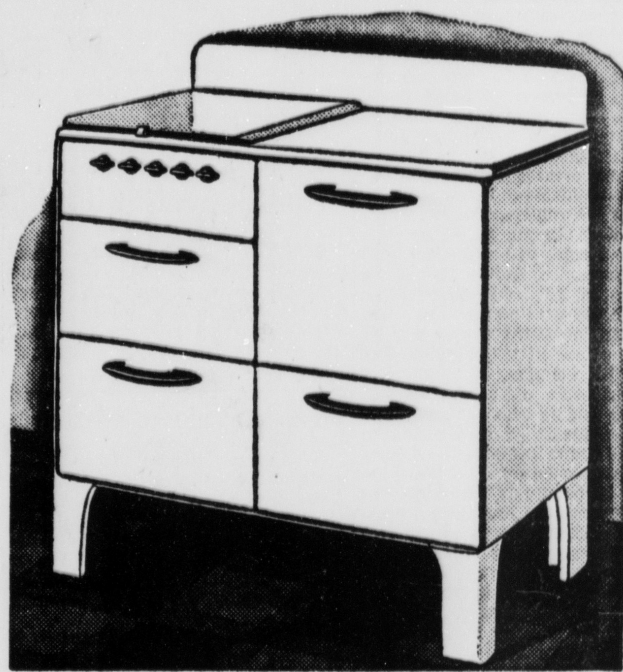
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
