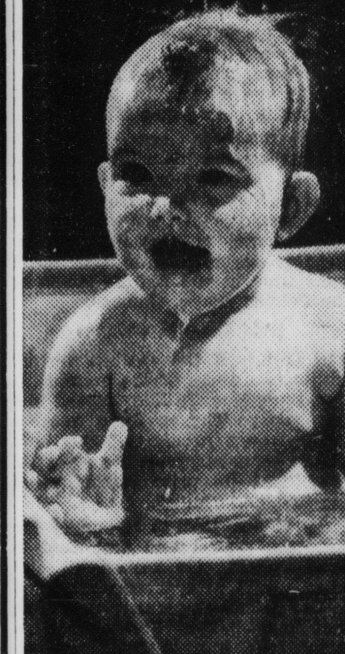

LANDON FLAYS SPENDING POLICY

Holds Roosevelt Responsible
For Slump, Predicts
New Decline.

COUNCIL BLUFFS, Ia., July 7 (U. P.).—Alf M. Landon, former Governor of Kansas and 1936 Republican Presidential candidate, charged last night that the present depression is a direct result of the Roosevelt administration's policies and methods.

He predicted that unless those policies are changed the country will be right back in another depression as soon as the Government's spend-lead program tapers off.

He spoke over a nation-wide radio broadcast in reply to the President's recent fire-side chat. His speech was the first of a series he plans to give during the coming congressional campaign.

He criticized the President for "financial recklessness," and said that if he "would practice what he preaches," as regards governmental administration, Republicans would co-operate with him to achieve social progress and economic recovery.

Hits Hague Stand

He admonished the President for not having taken a "decisive" stand during his fire-side chat against the free-speech activities of Mayor Frank Hague, Jersey City, N. J., a Democratic National Committee vice chairman. The President had condemned Mayor Hague's policies by inference and Mr. Landon said he had welcomed even that "vague reference."

"But," Mr. Landon said, "when he might have given real help, when he might have provided the moral leadership needed, he attempted to wash his hands of it. Even impatient, self-styled liberals of the New Deal should champion free-speech."

The President had described it as a "local matter" when asked what action he would take against Mayor Hague's refusal to permit labor leaders, Congressmen and others from speaking in Jersey City.

Praises New Deal Goals

Mr. Landon praised the President's social objectives, but sharply criticized New Deal methods and policies.

"As each day passes," said Mr. Landon, "it is becoming more and more clear that this depression is purely a political depression—a depression brought on by the methods and policies of the present Administration."

"Mind you, I do not say it is caused by the hopes, aspirations and objectives of the present Administration—I say it is a depression caused by the methods and policies of the present Administration."

Attacks Deficit Spending

Mr. Landon leveled his sharpest attack on the New Deal policy of deficit spending.

He declared Republicans were willing to co-operate with Mr. Roosevelt in achieving his objectives if he would adopt sound methods of seeking to attain them.

"We are, of course," he said, "willing to do anything we can to help our country out of this depression, but we predict that unless there is a change in the President's methods and policies, we will be right back in another depression as soon as the Government spending spurge is over."

"This has already happened once and it must be obvious that it will happen again unless confidence is restored and political abuses corrected."

Agrees with Goals

Mr. Landon said Republicans agreed with Mr. Roosevelt's humanitarian goals.

"I think," he said, "Mr. Roosevelt can count on the active co-operation and support of practically all Republican citizens in this country in all the humanitarian things he is trying to do."

"But we will not condone corruption and trickery on the part of his advisers and assistants merely because the ultimate aim is good."

KOBÉ'S STORM TOLL NOW PLACED AT 195

KOBÉ, July 7 (U. P.).—Authorities today placed the death toll here from storms and floods which swept the main island of Japan this week at 195. At least 460 in the prefecture of Hyogo were missing.

All city reservoirs were holding, but pipes were clogged and the water supply came from outside sources pumped in from nearby wells. There was no water shortage.

The official death toll from the storms and floods throughout the nation was more than 700 as rescue workers combed devastated areas for missing persons.

ELWOOD COMPLAINT FILED BY S. W. O. C.

Three Fired for Union Activities, Labor Group Says.

The Steel Workers Organizing Committee, Local No. 1076, has filed charges of unfair labor practices against the Monticello Manufacturing Co., Elwood, Ind., it was revealed today.

In its complaint, the union charged the company with discharging three employees for union activity in 1937, and in that year, of forming an organization called "The Association of Metal and Wire Workers."

The complaint also set forth the following grievances: That officials of the company intimidated employees who were members of the S. W. O. C. by tearing off their membership insignia and attempting to assault them physically.

That the company, by its foremen and officials, attempted to persuade employees who had signed application cards with the S. W. O. C. to withdraw their membership and to take out cards in the company union, known as the Association of Metal and Wire Workers.

That, by urging employees to refrain from joining the S. W. O. C., which is a C. I. O. union, the company afforded special privileges to an A. F. of L. union which it previously had encouraged.

National Labor Relations Board officials set a hearing on the charges for July 18 at Elwood. A trial examiner is yet to be appointed.

POSTOFFICE INCOME UP

WASHINGTON, July 7 (U. P.).—Postmaster General James A. Farley said today earnings of the post-office for the fiscal year 1938 ended June 30 were the greatest in history, exceeding slightly the 1927 income of \$726,000,000. Postal expenditures, Mr. Farley said, were kept well within the budget.
