

**GEN. MERRILL  
IS ASSIGNED TO  
FT. HARRISON**

Washington Brigade Leader  
Will Take Command  
Of 10th Infantry.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 2 (U. P.)—The War Department today announced promotion of Col. Adna R. Chaffee to brigadier-general and his assignment as commander of the mechanized cavalry brigade at Ft. Knox, Ky. He has been in command of a regiment since last August.

The department also announced assignment of Brig.-Gen. Dana T. Merrill, commanding the Washington, D. C., Provisional Brigade, to command of the 10th Infantry Brigade at Ft. Benjamin Harrison, Ind.

General Merrill is to be relieved by Col. Maxwell Murray, assistant commander of the Field Artillery School at Ft. Sill, Okla. Col. Murray is to be promoted to brigadier general on Dec. 1.

Col. Jonathan M. Wainwright, commander of the Third Cavalry at Ft. Myer, Va., was promoted to brigadier general today, and will command the Ft. Myer post.

The War Department also announced the transfer of Col. George S. Patton Jr., Ft. Clark, Tex., to Ft. Myer, Va., to succeed General Wainwright in command of the Third Cavalry. Command of the Fifth Cavalry at Ft. Clark, held by Col. Patton, will be assumed by Col. Cuthbert P. Stearns, Ft. Bliss, Tex.

Col. Henry W. Baird, now on duty with the organized reserves, Baltimore, Md., will succeed General Chaffee in command of the First Cavalry at Ft. Knox.
