



# Mrs. Roosevelt Selects Her Winter Wardrobe and Shops Early for Christmas Gifts

## Rho Delta to Honor Rushees at Spread


Rushees will be honor guests at the Thanksgiving spread which Alpha Chapter of Rho Delta Sorority will hold tonight at the Macabees Club.


