

LEAGUE IS READY FOR TWO-FRONT FIGHT ON SMOKE

Seeks New Legislation and
Sets Up Combustion
Institute.

The Indianapolis Smoke Abatement League today began a double program to reduce air pollution, with plans for seeking new legislation from City Council, and establishing a Combustion Institute.

The program was mapped at the League's annual meeting yesterday at which all officers were re-elected. City Council will be asked to pass an ordinance establishing a fee for the annual inspection of large heating plants in apartment and office buildings and factories.

The Combustion Institute would disseminate information on smoke abatement and provide instruction on the efficient operation of heating plants.

Discuss Ad Campaign

Possibility of conducting an advertising campaign to dramatize the menace of smoke to health also was discussed, but was taken under advisement.

Dr. Herman G. Morgan, City Health officer, was re-elected president of the league, Dr. John G. Benson, vice president, and Roy O. Johnson, counsel. Mrs. G. A. Van Dyke was re-elected second vice president; Miss Grace L. Brown, third vice president and J. Allen Dawson, treasurer.

Homer Rupard, engineer for the Indianapolis Water Co., was named chairman of a committee to organize the Combustion Institute. Headquarters for the institute are to be strung downtown.

Members of the committee are Mrs. Max Norris, Mrs. I. F. Jones, Mrs. M. I. Miller, William P. Sneathen, A. E. Klingensmith, Mrs. John Moore, Mrs. Van Dyke, Daniel J. Welsh and Mr. Johnson.

Plans Conference

Details of the proposed inspection ordinance are to be worked out next week, Mr. Johnson said. He said he would confer with Joseph G. Wood, City Council president, before attempting to draft a measure.

Co-operation of City Council members in furthering the league's activities was pledged during the recent election campaign, he said.

Under the ordinance, an annual inspection of large heating plants would be made by licensed City inspectors at a nominal fee to the property owner or manufacturer.

The aggregate amount taken in by this manner, Mr. Johnson said, "adequately would finance our program throughout the year."

It was pointed out at the meeting that a prerequisite for such an ordinance would be the addition to the City Building Commission of at least five men, including an engineer and four inspectors.

The present personnel includes J. W. Clinehens, City combustion engineer, and several assistants working part time.

Cites Chicago Law

Mr. Johnson said that the City of Chicago has a similar ordinance which raised \$93,000 in fees last year. This amount, he said, not only paid all expenses of that city's smoke abatement program but left a surplus in the city's general fund as well.

In an address to the members yesterday, Dr. Morgan pointed to air pollution as responsible for the pneumonia death rate in the city, which was 31 persons per 100,000 higher than in the County last year.

The pneumonia death rate, he said, was 150 persons for each 100,000 population while in the county it was 119.

"Air pollution and bad housing are heavily responsible for this difference in rates," he said.

CONFESSES HE SLEW RICH CHICAGO WOMAN

CHICAGO, Jan. 12 (U. P.)—Assistant State's Attorney Julius Sherwin announced today that Arthur Hue, 25, had confessed the slaying of Mrs. Mary Wong, 50, wealthy restaurant owner, whose body was

found Monday in her apartment in the Chinese section. Evidence had indicated the slaying was the result of a Tong dispute.

Mrs. Wong had employed Hue as a delivery boy. He admitted, Sherwin said, that his motive had been robbery and that he had obtained only \$18. He said he struck her twice with the heel of a shoe, then choked her, after entering her apartment through a window.

NEW YORK, Jan. 12 (U. P.)—A week ago Richard A. Acheson, 24, scion of the wealthy carbonium family, was put into Tombs Prison pending a hearing on his father's charges that he stole valuable pawns.

Edward G. Acheson, the father,
