

G. O. P. EDITORS OF STATE DUE IN CITY TOMORROW

Five Trophies to Be Given
Winners of Contests;
Bricker to Talk.

Five trophies will be awarded to winning Indiana publishers competing in newspaper contests sponsored by the Republican Editorial Association at its 61st annual convention at the Claypool Hotel tomorrow. The awards include the Braden-Hancock Cup for the best front page of any daily newspaper published by a member of the association. The Grim Cup will be awarded for the best front page of a Republican weekly newspaper issued last year. The Rummel Cup will go to the publisher of the newspaper having the best editorial page. The Republican State Committee trophy will be awarded for the best Republican editorials appearing during 1938.

Ohio's Governor to Speak

The Association Cup will go to the newspaper which enters the best all around three consecutive issues.

The session will start with a luncheon meeting and close with a banquet in the Claypool Hotel Riley room.

Gov. George W. Bricker of Ohio will be the principal speaker at the banquet.

Speakers at the afternoon session are to include Rep. James M. Knapp (R. Hagerstown), Speaker of the House; Senator William Jenner (R. Paoli), Republican "whip" of the Senate; and Homer E. Capehart, who staged the "Cornfield Conference" last summer.

Edwin V. O'Neil, first vice president, is slated to become association president; James E. Montgomery, New Albany Tribune editor, to become first vice president, and William Hargrave, now treasurer, second vice president. Neil McCallum is secretary.

REVIEW BY TAX BOARD IS BEGUN

Annual Check on Assessed
Property Valuations in
County Under Way.

The annual review of assessed property valuations was started today following appointment of one new member of the Marion County Tax Review Board and reappointment of another by Circuit Court Judge Earl R. Cox yesterday.

The new board member is Theodore M. Weiss, Democrat, who resigned as a County Jury Commissioner to accept the appointment.

Frank D. Brattain, Republican, was reappointed for his seventh consecutive year on the board. Mr. Weiss and Mr. Brattain began work today listing assessed valuations of all domestic corporations.

They will continue this work until about June 1 when the County Auditor, County Treasurer and County Assessor will join the board membership for review of valuations appealed from appraisals fixed by township assessors.
