

**PETERS WON'T  
OPPOSE M'NUTT  
WITHIN STATE**

But FHA Chief Is 'With Farley All the Way' Outside of Indiana.

WASHINGTON, March 28.—R. Earl Peters, Indiana FHA director and former Democratic state chairman, who is here today for a political conference with Postmaster General Farley, declared that he (Mr. Peters) will do nothing to stop Paul McNutt "in Indiana."

Outside of the state, however, he is "with Farley all the way," he said and was called here by him.

The Postmaster General and National Democratic Chairman is returning from the West today where he has been doing spade work in trying to secure control of delegations for the national convention in 1940.

Favors Garner-Farley Ticket

Stung by the Presidential bee himself, Mr. Farley is credited here with looking favorably at the moment on a Garner-Farley ticket with himself taking the Vice President's place while the Vice President tries for the White House.

Regardless of what the setup turns out to be, Mr. Farley will remain the arch foe of the Presidential aspirations of High Commissioner Paul V. McNutt, it is contended here.

Mr. Peters, who was ousted from the state chairmanship, checked for the United States Senatorial nomination and opposed for his present position as Federal Housing Administrator by the McNutt organization, expects the Indiana delegation to be 100 per cent for the State's native son candidate in 1940, he said. But should it prove impossible to obtain the nomination for Mr. McNutt, Mr. Peters would like to see the delegation follow Mr. Farley's leadership in the convention, he declared.

Denies Patronage Story

He denied a story, current here, that he will interest himself in the some 300 postmasterships over which Senators VanNuys and Morton exercise control as Democrats in the Republican districts. However, he said, he did take a hand in the recent Ft. Wayne postmastership dispute because that is his home town.

Mr. Peters expressed approval of the plan to let the local Democratic organizations select the postmasters.



**HOSEY CASE JURY  
TO GET DAMAGE BILL**

PHILADELPHIA, March 28 (U. P.)—Special Master David Bachman is to present to Federal Judge William H. Kirkpatrick today his findings on the physical damage phase of the Apex Hosiery Co.'s \$3,500,000 suit against the American Federation of Hosiery Workers.

Hearings were ended yesterday, as Mr. Bachman allowed additional claims of \$24,514.53. He previously had allowed claims aggregating \$41,187. The jury may consider the damage tomorrow.

Apex is suing the union, a C. I. O. affiliate, under the Sherman Anti-Trust Act for treble the damage allegedly caused during a 48-day sit-down strike in the company's mills in 1937.
