

FEAR IS BLAMED BY WILLKIE FOR IDLE FUNDS, MEN

Federal Policies Responsible, Hoosier Declares in Magazine Article.

NEW YORK, June 14 (U. P.)—Wendell L. Willkie, president of the Commonwealth & Southern Corp., said today that the Federal Government, by its conduct toward business, was keeping \$4,000,000,000 idle and 11,000,000 persons unemployed.

Writing in "Idle Money" in the Saturday Evening Post, Mr. Willkie said investors were afraid to put available capital to work because they were afraid of the Government. Mr. Willkie is a native of Elwood, Ind.

Cites 'Elements of Fear'

The man who fought against the Government for five years over the Tennessee Valley Authority and "lost one company in the process" summed up the present industrial and employment situation as follows:

"Government regulation, Government competition and Government discouragement of investment are the three elements of the fear that dominate the businessman and investors."

"And if we balance up the books, where are we?"

"1. We still have those 11,000,000 unemployed—nobody can get away from the fact."

"2. We have lying idle in the banks several billion dollars of money for investment."

"3. We have a need for all that money, and more, to be spent for the capital expenditures of industry."

"And, if we can add item No. 2 to item No. 3, then we can largely get rid of item No. 1."

But he continued, the only power which can bring that about is the people.

Plays 'Soak Rich' Policy

Mr. Willkie said the Government's tax program was especially discouraging to the investment of "pioneering money that goes to build up new industry and create new jobs."

"It is not taxes, per se, that I am criticizing here," he said. "It is the kind of tax that has been imposed."

"First of all, there is this business of 'soaking the rich.' If a man has an income of \$1,000,000, for example, the State and Federal Government will promptly take 84 per cent of it. If a man has an income of \$100,000, the State and Federal Government will promptly take 40 per cent of it."

Not content with this, that Mr. Willkie continues, the Federal Government adds a capital gains tax and tax on undistributed profits of corporations, both of which have the effect of keeping money out of new ventures and keep investors "from putting their money into new plants and new equipment."

Lists Federal Agencies

Commissions appointed to administer regulatory laws are making rules which "are superseding the laws of Congress," he said, and producing "a highly personal form of government—a government by caprice in which the good will of a commission chairman may have a considerable effect upon you and your business."

Under such a government, Mr. Willkie said, investors hesitate to invest.

Strict regulation of business gives the Government an opportunity, which it has not failed to grasp. Mr. Willkie said, of competing unfairly with private business through Government corporations.

He cited as examples the TVA, RFC, Commodities Credit Corp., the Housing Administration, Home Loan Banking Board, National Mortgage Association and others.

And business has no recourse in the courts, Mr. Willkie said, pointing to his defeat in the Supreme Court in the TVA case and to a similar defeat suffered by the Alabama Power Co.

Books Are Donated to Library at Rate Of 100 a Day.

L. Dickerson, Indianapolis public librarian, wasn't quite sure today whether Indianapolis housewives had finished spring housecleaning or not. At any rate, he said, the library is still being donated 100 books a day.

He told the School Board last night that since the first week in March when he appealed for books, 12,334 have been donated, compared with 1794 last year during the same period. Previous to his appeal through newspapers, over the radio and by streetcar posters, the donations had reached the lowest point in 12 years.

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


