

PSC APPROVES SCRAPPING OF 2 TRACTION LINES

Authorizes Abandonment of
Service to Terre Haute
And Louisville.

The Indiana Railroad today was authorized by the Public Service Commission to abandon two more traction lines.

The Commission formally approved the railroad company's petitions to abandon the Indianapolis-Terre Haute line and all service on the Seymour-Louisville branch of the Indianapolis-Louisville line.

Other Petitions Pending

Other petitions are pending before the Commission to substitute trucks and buses on the Indianapolis-Terre Haute route and substitute trucks on the Indianapolis-Louisville line, leaving only passenger services on the traction route between here and Seymour. No passenger buses are proposed between Seymour and Louisville.

The Commission authorized the railroad to fix the dates for stopping service on the lines with a 15-day notice period.

The Commission's action followed similar rulings handed down yesterday and last week by the Interstate Commerce Commission in Washington.

Testify to Losses

Petitions to abandon the lines were filed with the Public Service Commission six months ago. Railroad officials during several hearings over a period of two months testified that the lines have been operating at a loss for several years.

Coincident with the abandonment of the Indianapolis-Terre Haute line, City officials have been talking of the possibility of buying the railroad's right-of-way for a construction of a "free-line" highway between the Municipal Airport and downtown Indianapolis.

Dismantling of the traction line will pave the way for this proposed project.

NEW POST GIVEN TO DR. ROBBINS

Assumes Full Professorship
In Political Science
At Butler U.

Appointment of Roy M. Robbins as head of Butler University's history and political science department and director of the division of graduate instruction, was announced today by President D. S. Robinson.

Dr. Robbins, who has been an associate professor in his department, will assume a full professorship with his new position. He will succeed the late Dr. Paul L. Haworth.

A graduate of Earlham College and the University of Wisconsin, Dr. Robbins has taught at the University of Wisconsin, University of Washington, Seattle, Wash.; Western Reserve University, and at the University of Montana during the past summer. He has been at Butler since 1937.

NOVA SCOTIANS' NAZI SALES INTEREST FDR

HALIFAX, N. S., Aug. 16 (U. P.).—President Roosevelt was interested in the sale of pulpwood to Germany by Nova Scotia during his visit here yesterday, it was reported today.

A. S. MacMillan, acting Premier, quoted the President as having questioned him as to whether Nova Scotians felt it was good business to sell pulpwood to Germany and asked how much of the product was being shipped.

President Roosevelt resumed his cruise last night after a seven-hour stop here. The Presidential party is expected to stop at Sydney, Cape Breton, later today for supplies.

MORE FUNDS GIVEN CITY WPA PROJECTS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16.—Two WPA projects in Indianapolis have been allotted additional funds by Presidential approval. Senator Frederick VanNuys' office has announced.

A Statewide archives project, recently transferred from a Federal to State project classification, was given \$142,808. In this work an inventory is being made of records of historical societies in Indianapolis and throughout the state.

The project in which records in the Marion County building are being indexed and classified was given \$88,444 more. The work, begun a year ago, is directed by Mrs. Marie Sellers. Documents, some 80 years old, formerly were found by clerks "delving into cubbyholes and bins," the project proposal stated.

Convicts Best When Copying

Inmates at Indiana State Prison, Michigan City, who are taking a two-weeks art course, are better at copying than at original drawing, according to Harry Engle, Indiana University professor in charge of the class.

Prof. Engle said many prisoners have artistic ability but have had no training and so he is donating his services through the State Welfare Department. After some training, he said, prisoners probably will develop more originality.

Instruction is being given in oil, water color, pencil sketches, soap sculpture, clay modeling and designing in plastic wood. Prof. Engle also is teaching picture framing to prison carpenters.
