

NEW U. S. LABOR BOARD OF LESS POWER LOOMS

Dr. Leiserson, Friend of Wagner Law, Joins in Criticizing Majority.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22.—Probability that the next Congress will replace the present National Labor Relations Board with one of less power is increased by Board Member William M. Leiserson's devastating criticism.

The Leiserson dissent from the Pittsburgh Plate Glass Co. decision yesterday accused the Board majority of exceeding its authority under the Wagner law, of fixing bargaining units in defiance of union contracts, and of denying employees their legal right to a representative of their own choosing.

The significance of this criticism, from an official friendly to the Wagner law, is that Dr. Leiserson is the Administration's ace labor expert. He was transferred to the Labor Board last June by President Roosevelt for the specific purpose of restoring public confidence in a board under attack of both employers and the A. F. of L.

Board Records Studied

Now Dr. Leiserson in the Plate Glass case has challenged the Board majority on virtually the same issue on which the A. F. of L. attacked the Board's decision in the famous Pacific longshoremen's case last spring. It cannot be said, however, that Dr. Leiserson is pro-A. F. of L. and anti-C. I. O.

In the same Leiserson interpretation of the law benefited the C. I. O.—and then Board Member Edwin S. Smith agrees with him. In the similar Chrysler Kokomo decision, against the C. I. O. Chairman Warren Madden went with Dr. Leiserson, but not this time.

The special House investigating committee which, unlike Dr. Leiserson, is in part hostile to the Wagner law itself, is preparing to use the Leiserson dissents against the Board. The committee is now studying Board records and sending out sweeping questionnaires as a basis for its public hearings next month. It is believed to be sympathetic to the A. F. of L. demand for replacing the present Board.

Found Guilty of Coercion

In yesterday's decision the Board majority found the Pittsburgh company guilty of illegally coercing its employees by refusing to bargain collectively with the C. I. O. union as the exclusive representative in the bargaining unit fixed by the Board in an earlier decision.

The Board, without an election included in the bargaining unit the unorganized Crystal City, Mo., plant, as well as the other plants where the C. I. O. had a contract. The Board held that an employer-wide unit was the proper one.

Dr. Leiserson in effect accuses his fellow Board members of choosing on the basis of their own personal preferences the proper representative for employees, instead of allowing employees to choose for themselves as guaranteed by the Wagner law.
