

U.S. TO ARRAIGN 3 IN BANK CASE

Fred W. Shideler and Son
In Jail Here, Unable to
Furnish Bond.

Three men will be arraigned in Federal Court tomorrow, charged by a Federal Grand Jury with violating or aiding violations of the National Banking Act.

Those arrested yesterday were Roy O. Hadley, Westfield, former cashier of the Union State Bank there; Hamer C. Golding, Greenlawn automobile dealer, and his brother, Cedric L. Golding, Noblesville automobile dealer, who formerly lived at Carmel. All were released under \$5000 bond.

B. Howard Caughran, assistant District Attorney, said Hadley falsely certified checks on his bank, made out by the Goldings. At the time the overdraft was discovered by State bank examiners and Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. examiners, it had reached \$10,000. Mr. Caughran said, but the bank was reimbursed.

Meanwhile, District Attorney Val Nolan announced the indictment of Louis J. Severson, 6000 Broadway, on a charge of using the mails to defraud. Mr. Severson, head of the American Cellulose Co., 307 N. Pennsylvania St. is in Ohio.

Mr. Nolan said Mr. Severson is alleged to have sent circulars through the mails to a number of firms in other cities offering to buy scrap film and metals but that some of those who shipped the materials to him failed to receive their money.

All 10 of the 80 indicted by the Grand Jury have been arrested. Fred W. Shideler and his son, William A. Shideler, Indianapolis investment brokers, surrendered yesterday to U. S. Marshal Julius Witscher and were taken to Marion County jail when they were unable to furnish \$7500 bond each. They were indicted on charges of using the mails to defraud and violation of the Federal Securities Act.

NAVY PLANES DUE IN PHILIPPINES SUNDAY

MANILA, P. I., Sept. 22 (U. P.)—The Navy planes which left Honolulu Tuesday are expected to reach the Cebu, N. Y., Sunday afternoon. No authorization said tonight.

There has been no direct word of the fliers since they left Honolulu, but it was believed there were 15 ships in the squadron in charge of Lieut. Comm. Sam LaBache, and that they had stopped at Wake Island, Midway Island and Guam. It was the first time any U. S. war plane flight had been made west of the International Dateline.


